Pastor's "Lion" Message for May 2024

And let the one who believes in me drink (John 7:38).

It is generally held that a person can only last three days without water. Without water life ceases to exist. It is essential for survival.

A few years ago my grandmother-in-law's farm had to dig a new well. The old well was beginning to decay and started to give water that was no longer safe to drink. Even though there was no longer any livestock kept at the farm, a new well was still necessary. People lived there; people still live there. To this day my sister-inlaw and her family live at this location and maintain a flower garden and a vegetable garden. Without water these ventures could not take place. And so a new well was drilled. Welldiggers (yes that is the actual term for a people who dig or drill wells; I looked it up) had to drill the new well to a depth of 250 feet to find good, clean water. It was a big and expensive project. But it needed to be done especially if people wished to keep living at the farm.

Jesus calls himself living water. He invites persons who seek pure water to come to him and drink. "Drinking from his word" we receive the life-giving good news of acceptance, forgiveness, love and life eternal. Encouraged to dig deep into God's Word we drink by the promise of the One who saves.

The Rev. Ben Lander, currently serving at St. Andrew Lutheran Church in Muncy, will be preaching at the Annual Memorial Service at Old Immanuel Lutheran Church, 2633 Lime Bluff Road, Muncy. The service will take place on Sunday, June 2, 2024, at 2:30pm. Mrs. Joy Barto will accompany the service on the church's antique pump organ.

Old Immanuel is considered to be the mother church of Lutheranism in Lycoming County. Founded in 1791, it lived until its doors shut permanently in 1920. The first structure built on the property was of log; the second and third (the current) structures were of brick. The current building was dedicated in 1869, and contains two cornerstones, one in German dated 1832, and one in

English dated 1869. At least 9 Revolutionary Soldiers and 5 Civil War Soldiers are buried in the historic cemetery. The church was built on land donated by Henry and Barbara Shoemaker, of "Shoemaker Mills" at the Routes 442/405 intersection.

At one time, there was a school associated with Old Immanuel, and the church contained a gallery, a wine-glass pulpit, and enough straight-backed pews to seat 600 people.

Old Immanuel closed its doors for regular services in 1920, after giving rise to 19 other Lutheran congregations. Some of these have also closed their doors, such as Trinity (Huntersville), St. Paul's (Millville), Germany Church (at one time known at St. John's), Katy's Church (at one time known as Immanuel Lutheran), Christ Lutheran (Montgomery), Messiah (Alvira), the Stone Church in Elimsport, and Zion's, also in Elimsport. Others, such as Moreland Lutheran (at one time known at St. John's) and St. Mark's Lutheran (Lairdsville) have taken on new identities as they have become home to other congregations.

Churches that have sprung up from Old Immanuel that continue with the Lutheran tradition include Trinity and Mount Zion, Hughesville; St. Andrew, Muncy; St. James, Muncy; Messiah, Clarkstown; St. John's, Gordner's Grove; St. John's (Brick), Montgomery; and Bethany, Montoursville.

The public is invited to attend this service as well as to tour the historic church. Light refreshments will be served on the church lawn after the service. Please note that the church does not have running water or electricity. For more information, or to follow Old Immanuel more closely, "Like" us on FaceBook!!!




