The first time that I read verse 29 was part of a daily lectionary reading (John 10:22-30). I skimmed over it hardly paying any attention to the words. Looking back this probably was because I was associating verse 29 with the latest "greatest thing". Read verse 29 again. This is no ad. This is no promo offer. This is God's Truth. This is Good News. This is the Word of Life. All that our God, the God of all creation, the Father Almighty,

Do you have shoes you no longer wear but they still are wearable? If so **Soles4Souls** is in need of them. Messiah's Women of the ELCA cordially invite you to an information workshop that will explain the work of Soles4Souls and the need for your donations.

Soles4Souls was established as a nonprofit in 2006 in Nashville, TN. Their mission is: *Creating sustainable jobs and providing relief through the distribution of shoes and clothing around the world.*

Come and hear Abby Yorks of Middleburg, PA explain the goals and scope of this organization. To date S4S has given 94 million pairs of shoes and items of clothing to people in 138 countries and all 50 US states!

A Continental Breakfast will be served from 8:30 -9:00, followed by two one-hour presentations where Ms. Yorks will give an overview of Soles4Souls, explaining her involvement as the Pennsylvania representative for the nonprofit and how S4S is working to eradicate poverty here and around the world.

There is no fee for this event, but pre-registration is requested by April 1, 2024. A sign-up sheet is in the Narthex. We can carpool if there is interest.

A free-will offering will be taken at the conclusion of the workshop for Soles4Souls.

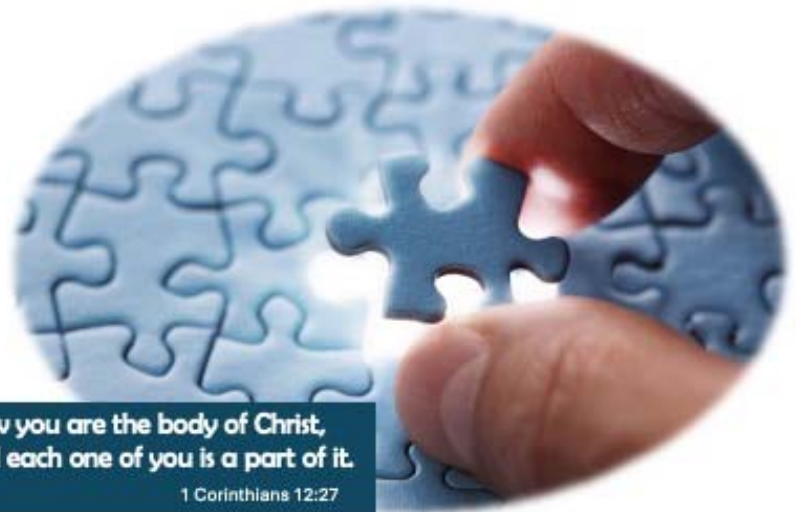

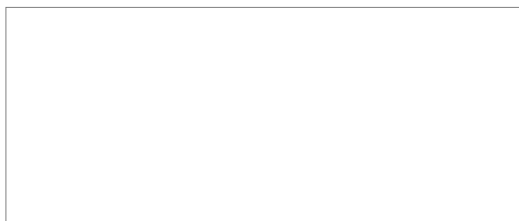
