INTRODUCTION TO TODAY'S READINGS

This Sunday's image of the life the risen Christ shares with us is the image of friendship. We are called to serve others as Jesus came to serve; but for John's gospel, the image of servanthood is too hierarchical, too distant, to capture the essence of life with Christ. Friendship captures the love, the joy, the deep mutuality of the relationship into which Christ invites us. The Greeks believed that true friends are willing to die for each other. This is the mutual love of Christian community commanded by Christ and enabled by the Spirit.

44While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. 45The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, 46for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, 47"Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" 48So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.


*THE PEACE



Nicolaus Ludwig von Zinzendorf, renewer of the church, hymnwriter, died 1760.

Sunday, May 9

When he was 22, a group of Moravian Christians asked permission to live on Zinzendorf land. He agreed and eventually worldwide Moravian missions emanated from this community. Zinzendorf participated in these missions is also remembered for writing many "pietistic" (combing doctrine with holy living practices) hymns of our faith.

Matthias, Apostle

Friday, May 14, 2021

Matthias was the apostle added to the 12 after Jesus' resurrection as a replacement for the dead Judas Iscariot. He had travelled among the followers of Jesus throughout the Lord's ministry. Formally commemorated on February 24, Matthias' celebration is moved to May 14 in agreement with most Western calendars.
