THE SECOND LESSON......Romans 3:19-26


19Now we know that whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. 20For "no human being will be justified in his sight" by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin.

21But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, 22the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, 23since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; 24they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, 25whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; 26it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus.

27Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. 28For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.







***INVITATION TO COMMUNION**

Persons may come forward to the chancel to receive Holy Communion. This format will be more "continuous" noting the following procedure:

• Communicants, masked and observing social distancing, are asked to come forward as directed by ushers by way of the center aisle, take a cup from the tray provided and receive the bread from Pastor Vasey.

- Once receiving the bread, communicants will proceed to one of two stations (left or right) to receive wine from the pouring chalice.
- After receiving wine, communicants will place the empty cup in the designated tray and return to their pew by way of the side aisles.

Please do not kneel at the rail. Kneeling at the rail will return at a time to be determined by pastor and Church Council.

WELCOME L. JANE KLINE! Today (L) Jane Kline is received into the membership of St. Mark's by way of her "Letter of Transfer of Membership" from First United Methodist Church, Fort Smith, AR. Welcome Jane! **TODAY IS REFORMATION SUNDAY, OCTOBER 31.** Today, "All Hallows Eve", commemorates the anniversary of Martin Luther posting is 95 Theses, a summary of abuses in the church of his day, to the Castle Church Door, Wittenberg, Germany, 1517. Luther chose the date of October 31 because it was (and still is) the day before All Saints' Day when many attended worship. The message of the 95 Theses and all of Lutheran theology is that the gospel comes by grace alone, through faith alone by Scripture alone. Reformation Day (or the Sunday closest to October 31) proclaims that by God's free and full love all are set free from sin and death.

CONSECRATION SUNDAY. In addition to Reformation Day, October 31, 2021, serves as our Consecration Sunday (the day we return our pledges for the next calendar year). COMMEMORATIONS

All Saints Day

Monday, November 1, 2021

The custom of commemorating all of the saints of the church on a single day goes back at least to the third century. All Saints Day celebrates the baptized people of God, living and dead, who make up the body of Christ. On November 7, the Sunday following November 1, St. Mark's will remember our faithful friends and family who have died during the past year.

Martín de Porres, renewer of society, died 1639

Wednesday, November 3, 2021

Martín was the son of a Spanish knight and a freed black slave from Panama. As a lay brother in the Order of Preachers (Dominicans), he engaged in many charitable works in Lima, Peru. He founded an orphanage, a hospital, and a clinic for cats and dogs.
