INTRODUCTION TO TODAY'S READINGS

On Pentecost, we celebrate that we have been given an Advocate to accompany us. Poured out in wind and fire, water, wine, and bread, the Holy Spirit abides in and among us. We give thanks that God speaks to each of us, no matter our origins, language, or life path.

THE FIRST LESSON......Acts 2:1-21

1When the day of Pentecost had come, [the apostles] were all together in one place. 2And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. 3Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. 4All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

5Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. 6And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. 7Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? 8And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? 9Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, 10Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, 11Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." 12All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" 13But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

14But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them,

"Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. 15Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. 16No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

17'In the last days it will be, God declares,

that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh,

and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy,

and your young men shall see visions,

and your old men shall dream dreams.

18Even upon my slaves, both men and women,

in those days I will pour out my Spirit;

*PUBLIC AFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM (Confirmation)

The confirmands, their families, President of the Church Council join the pastor at the chancel.

President of Council These persons have been instructed in the Christian faith and desire to make public affirmation of their baptism.

The President reads the names of the confirmands.

Pastor Beloved in Christ: In Holy Baptism our Lord Jesus Christ received you and made you members of his Church. In the community of God's people, you have learned from God's Word God's loving purpose for you and all creation. You have been nourished at our Lord's Table and called to witness to the Gospel of of Jesus Christ. Now, therefore, I ask you to join with as many as here present and profess your faith in Christ Jesus, the faith in which we baptize.

The congregation stands and all say the Apostles' Creed:

C I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary.
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried.
He descended into hell.
On the third day he rose again.
He ascended into heaven,
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again to judge the living and the dead

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The congregation is seated. The confirmands remain standing.

P You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with in Holy Baptism:

to live among God's people, to hear God's Word and share at the Lord's Table, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ in word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Christ, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

Confirmands I do, and ask God to help and guide me.

P Let us pray. Gracious Lord, through water and the Spirit you make us your own. Continue to strengthen these young persons in Christ through the Holy Spirit. Increase in them your gifts of grace: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and fear of the Lord, the spirit in your presence; through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord.

C Amen.

Each confirmand kneels. The pastor and parents lay their hands on the head of each person.

P Father in heaven, for Jesus' sake, stir up in (*NAME*) the gift of your Holy Spirit; confirm his faith, guide his life, empower him in his serving, give him patience in his suffering, and bring him to everlasting life.

After each confirmation the congregation answers, Amen.



P The peace of the Lord be with you always.





COMMEMORATIONS

Boniface, Bishop of Mainz, missionary to Germany, martyr, died 754 Sunday, June 5, 2022

Boniface was a native of England who became a Benedictine monk and was called to missionary work among the Vandal tribes of Germany. With fellow workers, he established churches and schools, and he also worked to reform the church.

Seattle, chief of the Duwamish Confederacy, died 1866

Tuesday, June 7, 2022

Noah Seattle led a coalition of tribes, and convinced them to live peacefully with encroaching white settlers. When he became a Roman Catholic, he held morning and evening prayer with his tribe. The city of Seattle is named for him.

Bede

Columba, died 597; Aidan, died 651; Bede, died 735; renewers of the church *Thursday, June 9, 2022*

These three monks from the British Isles helped keep the light of learning alive during the Middle Ages. Columba founded three monasteries off the coast of Scotland. Aidan was a pastor who led people to works of charity. The Venerable Bede was a Bible translator, historian, and hymnwriter.



Barnabas, Apostle Saturday, June 11, 2022

Barnabas was not numbered among the twelve apostles, but the book of Acts gives him that title. After Paul was converted to Christianity, Barnabas welcomed him to Jerusalem, and later the two traveled together on missionary journeys.
