We offer with joy and thanksgiving what you have first given us: signs of your precious love.

These, or similar, words are repeated each Sunday after the offering. We may just say them; we may think about what we are saying, or we may earnestly pray in thankfulness to our God for all that He has done for us.

It is time to put those words into our hearts and into action. Consecration Sunday is October 20 this year. We understand the concept that, from a biblical perspective, financial stewardship is not money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, we know that financial contributions are a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes. Since this goes against our natural tendencies to want to regard everything as our own possessions, we must continue to think about this and make it a part of our life a bit at a time. Consecration Sunday is a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving. Again, we are responding with joy and thanksgiving.

Every attendee and member, who completes an Estimate of Giving Card, does so voluntarily while attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday, October 20. We urge everyone to attend, even those who are hesitant to complete a card, because the procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend worship on Consecration Sunday, October 20. In the coming weeks, please think prayerfully about the blessings God has given to you, and about how you are called to share those blessings.

The other part of the event is the celebration meal that follows each worship service on October 20. At services on October 6 and 13 we'll be asking for your reservation for the breakfast following the 8:00 service or the lunch following the 10:30 service on Consecration Sunday. It is important that every member take part.

Our friend Pastor W. Stevens Shipman will again speak to us on how Stewardship (our works and efforts) coincides with what we do after we say "We believe...". Stewardship is, indeed, our faith in action. Let us be thankful for all of our blessings..

God used what she witnessed there to burden her heart to sell all of her earthly belongings and return to Haiti in the summer of 2000 to open a school. Today there are more than 260 children in attendance. Her faith has brought her through many challenges, including the school being completely demolished by the 2010 Earthquake.

The Christian Light School is a non-denominational Christian ministry. Haitians need to be given the necessary tools if they are to eventually become leaders in their country. But children simply cannot afford to attend school without our help. So, we provide textbooks, uniforms, school supplies, 2 meals per day and medical and dental care. They learn to read in French, English, and Creole and communicate with sign language. Graduates score very high on the Haitian state exams. They are among the best educated students in Haiti and are expected to grow up to assume leadership positions--Christian leaders. This will be an exciting testimony of what God is doing in Haiti!
