Moving for Better Hospitality

One of the goalsuggestions that was made this summer asked if we could discern a way to increase room for hospitality,

especially after the 10:30 service. After listening to this, and discussing it for several months, the Property Committee proposed that the pew second from the back of the nave be removed and the pew third from the back be turned 180 degrees, thus creating an area where folks might sit for that wonderful after-service conversation. It would also provide a place to better organize processions just before the service begins. The Council heard the report, agreed with the reasoning, and approved this on a trial basis. We will be testing this in the near future...as soon as the Property Committee rounds up six men and a boy to physically move the very heavy and awkward pews.

There were so many things done so very well in planning our nave in 1959, but the cramped size of the narthex is a built-in problem. If the church would be built with today's standards, the narthex gatheringarea would likely be about half the size of the nave!




