-Approved the feasibility of seeking an independent audit before the end of the year.

-Clarified its wishes to the synod concerning the interim pastor process.

—Planned the next regular meeting for November 21, 2016.



A Message from the President of Council



Many of you have been wondering what is happening with the process of finding a replacement for Pastor Elkin when he leaves at the end of December.

The answer to that is very easy. We can't and we won't.

Pastor has given his all to St. Mark's for over 20 years. For that reason alone, Bishop Collins has agreed with us in that we will not begin the call process for a permanent pastor until later this spring.

We will have a pastor starting in January. Council has two options and they are being considered at the present time.

The second option is to have an intentional interim pastor. This person will serve St. Mark's for a year on a full-time basis. The contract may be renewed for six months if needed.

Bishop Collins will name either an interim or an intentional interim pastor before this year ends. Council will have to approve the appointment and negotiations will be made with the newly appointed interim/ intentional interim with the help of the West Branch Conference The first option is to have **Dean**, Pastor Kerry Aucker.
