#### **Council Notes**

The congregational council met on Monday, September 18, 2017, and determined the following:

- Approved the Reformation Committee's recommendation that the loose plate offering on Reformation Sunday, October 29, be designated to the Fund for Leaders, which is the Synod Seminary Scholarship Fund
- Agreed to recommend to Lutheran Shared Ministry that the loose plate offering at the joint Reformation service on Wednesday, October 25 be designated to hurricane relief
- <u>Celebrate</u> bulletin inserts, which are commonly used by ELCA congregations, will be purchased from Augsburg Press on a trial basis for three months.
- ◆ Session 4 of the Healthy Congregations Workshops will be held at St. Mark's on October 28.
- Affirmed that Saturday evening services will continue to be held as long as parishioners continue to attend.
- Morning Prayer will be held at 7 AM on Sundays, in addition to Monday through Thursday at 9 AM.



In this way it helps inspire continuing work toward the visible Christian unity, which is Christ's prayer.

On each of these three Wednesdays, both Lutheran and Catholic leaders will lead us in discussion, Week one will center on Agreements and Disagreements on the Church, the following week is discussion regarding the Agreements and Disagreements on Ministry, and the last week, focus is on the Eucharist.



## TRYING SMALL



The Lutheran Church in Liberia (LCL) has thirty -some odd parishes. Unlike in the US, a parish in the LCL is typically made up of one large central congregation working in conjunction with many smaller congregations called "preaching points." The Nyor Parish up in Nimba county has nearly 50 preaching points.

The main thing I do is teach. I teach lay ministers for the Lutheran Church in Liberia and I teach soon-to-be pastors for the denominational potpourri of students at the Gbarnga School of Theology. One of the things I love about Liberia is it is an easy place to be helpful and when I'm not teaching that is what I am trying to do.

The LCL students in Totota amaze me. These men and women leave their families and livelihoods for nine weeks (4 times!!) just so they can learn about God and better serve the Church. These folks are lay ministers!!! Their commitment to the Lord and willingness to sacrifice blows me away.

Liberian English: A chi-chi-pulley is a gossip or person who doesn't know when to keep their

mouth shut. A chi-chi-pulley bucket is a translucent bucket used by folks who are selling things on the roadside. The bucket can't keep a secret so you can see what it is they're selling.

## Thanking God for Blessings

Beginning in the late 19th century, Lutheran women were given small Thankoffering boxes to place in a special location in their homes to remind them of blessings received. They would add coins to those boxes with a prayer each time they would think of a particular blessing. It could be a small thing like a baby's smile or a new flower opening.

Or, it could be safety after a storm or recovery from an illness. Those offerings would be given to God in gratitude. Women today are encouraged to continue this tradition. If you wish, small boxes are available in the Narthex, or you can make your own container.

Thankoffering Sunday this year at St. Mark's will be November 5th. Offerings should be made out to St. Mark's and clearly marked as "Thankoffering".
