
Ending Hunger. Enriching Lives 20,000 Meals Packed

Locally, 13.5% of our Lycoming County population struggles with food insecurity (www.feedingamerica.org). To help reduce that insecurity we packaged 20,000 meals of pasta with tomato basil sauce that were distributed to local food banks and food pantries in the Greater Williamsport Area including The New Love Center in Jersey Shore, Redeemer Lutheran Church and the Central Pennsylvania Food Bank.

The Outreach Committee is thankful for the New Love Center in Jersey Shore (Pastor Kerry Aucker) and St. Luke Lutheran Church in Williamsport (Pastor Elizabeth Aurand) for donating \$4,350 toward the packaging of the 20,000 meals. Thrivent /Visa debit cards and other individual monetary donations from the congregation totaling more than \$1,100 were also donated. The Outreach Committee thanks all the volunteers who helped with unloading supplies, staging Fellowship Hall and other areas, packaging, providing refreshments and cleaning up this event. Together with community members we were able to address the food insecurity that exists in our area.

Several times in the past few weeks I have been struck by the talents of many of the folks in our congregation. Some we search out in the

paper and a few send us their good works, however, most of them hide their light under the proverbial bush-ell!

Skimming through the Williamsport Sun Gazette's Living section, I caught a glimpse of artwork from Elizabeth Haussmann and a little further down another photo of a creation done by Hannah Haussmann. Check it out! Elizabeth Haussmann also swam at a Special Olympics swim meet at Bucknell University in April. She placed 1st overall in the 25 M backstroke (out of 36 competitors) with a time of 28:05. She also brought home a 6th place ribbon and a 7th place ribbon. We are so proud of Elizabeth!

Several of our young people are competing in the Odyssey of the Mind – Hannah Haussmann and Halle Clark (granddaughter of Gary and Donna) were part of the WAHS team which continued to the state competition where they missed moving on by one point, earning third place! How sad, but great work nevertheless. Mia Clark, another granddaughter, is a part of the Williamsport Area Middle School team and they finished in first place at states and go on to worlds at Ohio State University in May.

Sean Jensen, part of the 9th grade Loyalsock High School basketball team, was pictured in the newspaper with the rest of the Michael Durrwachter Memorial Tournament winning team. Coach Datres says "They are one of the best and talented 9th grade teams I've coached! High praise indeed!

Reading the tiny print in the honor roll listings I discovered Sean Jensen, Jonah Schreckengast, Grace Schreckengast and Taylor Wentzel on the high honor roll at Loyalsock High School and Sadie Wentzel on the honor roll. Ben Haussmann and Hannah Haussmann were both on Williamsport High School's High Honor Roll for their 3rd marking period.

Four years and one month after the renowned Dallas Brass Quintet last performed in Williamsport, Grace and Jonah Schreckengast again had the chance to play in a student outreach portion of the Dallas Brass' concert at the CAC. The professional musicians believe that involving young musicians to rehearse with them, spend time in sessions & clinics, and then invite them on the stage to play a few pieces with the ensemble can inspire a whole new generation to be excited about music! The musicians who participated cannot stop talking about their experience!

I opened the newspaper and what did I see but a re-

view of a new book by our own Melinda Wentzel - impressive! To quote from the review "this trim, breezy volume is the first from Williamsport area blogger and full time Mom and is titled "Deliverance – A Survival Guide for parenting twins." They add however that you don't even have to be a parent to enjoy this book. Published in February through Amazon the book have several five star reviews at the website, along with various encomiums from other writers and moms that appear in the opening pages. Congratulation to Mindy –great to have a celebrity in our midst!

We pray for God to watch over them and grant them discernment, wisdom and strength in their faithful convictions. Their memento is an address book with their name on it in which they can record contact information for mentors and friends from St. Mark's to use as a "lifeline" should the need arise (Regis, I'd like to phone a friend).

We also recognize parents as they experience their children leaving the nest. May they come to understand that the only way we truly keep hold of something is by letting go and that they take comfort in the knowledge that God will be with these young adults as they take the next step in their lives.

We pray that God will be with all of them and guide them into a new, stronger relationship with each other and with Him.

At an extended hospitality after the 10:30 service, hopefully in the courtyard, there will be opportunity to wish the youth well, encourage the parents and record contact information.

On Sunday, June 3, we move to a single service on Sundays at 9:30. On the same day, morning prayer on Sundays moves from 7:00 to 8:30 am.

Our present schedule resumes on September 9.
