If growing in faith is truly your #1 priority in life, shouldn't it top your list of New Year's resolutions? Sure, there's nothing wrong with losing weight or paying off debt...but what about your faith? What about your Christian New Year's Resolutions?

Here's a list of Christian New Year's Resolutions. It might spark some ideas or be helpful in picking a really good one:

- 1. Read Your Bible 20 Minutes a Day, Every Day
 Sure, reading the Bible consistently may not sound
 like a very glamorous or interesting Christian New
 Year's Resolution at first, but it really does make a
 difference!
- 2. Go to Church Every Week without Fail
 Is going to church really necessary? Yes. The New
 Year is the perfect time to get back in the habit if it's
 been a while.

3. Set Aside 20 Minutes Each Day to Pray

Sometimes it's easier to *consume* information all day long — magazines, podcasts, TV...those things are definitely good. Pray during your morning or evening commute

Pray on your lunch break

Pray while making dinner

Pray with your kids before bed every night

The possibilities are endless!

4. Join a Bible Study

Does your church have a regular Bible study or do you know of one in your area? If not — ask around! You can even create your own.

Not only is this Christian New Year's Resolution a great way to dig into the Bible for greater insights, but you can find some great community this way as well.

5. Try Fasting

Fasting is a spiritual discipline that is very powerful, but often overlooked. Maybe this year is the year you want to read up on it and try it out?

6. Start Tithing

The Scriptures are very clear — Christians are called

to be generous. If you haven't gotten in the tithing habit yet, now is a great time to start! Even if you can't give a lot, start with *something*. You can always work your way up as your faith grows (and it will!)

7. Forgive Past Grudges

The Bible makes it abundantly clear — if you are a Christian, you are expected to forgive those who have hurt you. Note: This doesn't mean what they did is okay, but you do need to get rid of any grudges or un-forgiveness you may be harboring in your heart.

8. Find a Mentor or Accountability Partner

It's one thing to say you're going to make a change in your life — it's another to find someone to keep you accountable to actually make that change. If you're feeling stuck — or just serious about changing — find a mentor or accountability partner to help hold you accountable.

9. Be a More Loving/Involved Spouse, Parent, Sibling, or Friend

We're all guilty of letting our relationships slide a bit at times. Ready to make this year the year you change that? Don't promise to just "do better." Get specific. What are 1-5 specific actions you are going to do to improve your relationships and when are you going to do them?

10. Be Content with What You Have

It is difficult to be content in America. There are always ads and commercials surrounding us, reminding us to want more, more, more. This year — maybe you want to get intentional about fighting that urge. Perhaps you'd like to try a "No Spend" month, and then save that money for something important or give it to charity?

11. Refuse to Gossip

Are you guilty of gossiping? Maybe this year is the year you decide to change that.

12. Do Random Acts of Kindness

This is a fun one — and it's actually really easy to do if you're willing to get creative! Choose a set number to do every week or month. It will be well worth it!
