



Pastor's

Dear Members and Friends of St. Mark's,



Joseph, Guardian of Our Lord. Many times Joseph gets lost in the shuffle of things; especially during the Seasons of Advent and Christmas. I have a hunch that is why the Church Calendar has retained his feast day of March 19, to remind us that Joseph has much to teach us and should not be brushed aside and referred to as simply "Mary's husband".

Joseph was a man of faith. Joseph epitomized faith as trust; trust in God's plan. It's easy to forget that Joseph was visited by an angel just as was Mary, Elizabeth, Zechariah and the shepherds; how he learned of the gospel by divine revelation and not human witness. If Joseph had not taken the angel's words to heart, he might have made the choice to break off his engagement to Mary; to choose the obvious and rush to judgment as was the law. Instead Joseph chose to trust God. Joseph chose to hear the good news; he chose to live the good news. Joseph is an example of how Jesus changes lives. Jesus asks us to consider God's possibilities in the midst of a society and world that announces there is only hate and judgment. Joseph teaches us that the obvious, the literal, the legal, the reasonable, the popular, isn't always of God. As Jesus teaches, "The Spirit blows where the Spirit will (John 3:8)" and we are asked to be receptive to the Spirit's invitation.

The example of Joseph is an example of how we as followers of Jesus should live our lives; how we are to embrace with trust God's promises. Lent is a reminder of that truth; it is a time of reflection; a time to remember God's love and God's promises. Lent fosters within us discipleship; it proclaims to us that following Jesus means to trust in the Spirit; to consider God's work and way in this world as did Joseph.

Years ago there was a popular commercial for orange juice: "Orange juice—it isn't just for breakfast anymore!" A similar sentiment can be said with regard to remembering Joseph in the Season of Lent: "Joseph, he isn't just for Christmas!" Joseph like all of the saints of scripture, provides a biblical and faithful example of life lived for and by Christ.







The Project Linus Susquehanna Valley Chapter

is a 100% volunteer nonprofit organization that provides love, a sense of security, warmth and comfort to children who are seriously ill, traumatized or otherwise in need, through the gifts of bright, new, handmade washable blankets, quilts and afghans. In our area, these blankets are distributed to UMPC Williamsport, Muncy Valley, Jersey Shore and Lock Haven Hospitals.

In addition, we deliver to Wise Options for Women, Family Promise, Warrior Run School District, Daniel's closet, other social services, police, and fire departments. In 2018, 800 blankets were distributed in our area; in 2019 that number increased to over 900. The need continues to grow as the weather turns colder and children are forced to sleep in their coats because the family can't afford heat.

With the aid of volunteers, we are establishing a Williamsport Community Make a Blanket day at St. Luke on May 2. The local chapter in Lewisburg hosts one every year, but many from this area can't attend. This way our community can help.

We are collecting materials for quilts, hand-tied fleece blankets, knitted and crocheted blankets. Items we need:

- NEW Cotton children's fabric
- Batting
- New flat bedsheets
- Minimum 2 yards of fleece (this makes one blanket)
- Take an already assembled kit of yarn to make granny squares or knit a blanket.

We will also accept donations of new or handmade quilts, afghans, and blankets at the event.

INTERFAITH CONVERSATIONS

Conversations in the Holy Land: On January 8th, eight United Methodists from the Williamsport Area led by the Rev. Lenore Hosier from Saint John's-Newberry UMC boarded a flight to Tel Aviv from JFK to spend a week of immersion in the Land of the Bible. They joined with 34 other pilgrims from a variety of other Christian traditions to visit the sites of both the Old and New Testaments. Beginning in the North, they went to places such as Tel Dan, the Mount of the Beatitudes, and Capernaum. They took a boat across the Sea of Galilee and passed the snow-capped peaks of Mount Hermon on their way to the Golan Heights. From there, they ventured south along the Jordan to Jericho, Qumran, Masada, and the Dead Sea. A few final days around Bethlehem and ancient Jerusalem wrapped up the weeklong trip, but this was not the full extent of their experience.

Among the other pilgrims was the Rev. Dr. Gary Mason, a Methodist minister, professor and conflict transformation consultant from Northern Ireland who led daily chats about peace-building and the Middle East. The group met Muslims, Christians, and Jews and got their perspectives on the situation in Israel and Palestine.

Pilgrims had opportunity to go to meals in the community in both Palestinian and Israeli homes to have



open dialogue with people with differing viewpoints. At the trip's end, many agreed that the trip was life-changing, not only in their faith-walk but also in their thoughts about people from other faiths and in political views in the Middle East. It was not just the rocks and ancient churches that told stories of faith, but the people themselves who ate together, struggled together, laughed together and had fellowship with one another that allowed the participants to experience God in a profound, new way.

Rev. Hosier is part of the United Churches' Interfaith Dialogue Commission and willing to share resources about the Holy Land and Interfaith Dialogue. Fr. William Corcoran of St. Boniface/St. Lawrence Catholic Parish, with extensive work in the Middle East, is also a helpful resource for those interested in learning more or traveling to that part of the world.


