Many have said it: Pastors, bishops, doctors, politicians, journalists, members of St. Mark's, people on the street; "We're beginning to see light in the darkness! COVID is waning!"

Yes, it does appear to be true! Yes, the nightmare of COVID-19 is beginning to loosen its grip and conditions are improving! We're not there yet and we have to be vigilant. The beginning of the end of COVID-19 is its own Easter story. Easter, or to be more precise, "The Resurrection of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ", is the defeat of sin and death, of darkness giving way to light. Consider the Easter story from Mark (Mark 16:1-2):

Mark, in his brevity tells a grand story: The sun, which in scripture can be a metaphor for the Son, had risen flooding all the world with light. The Light has come and has defeated the darkness.

The good news concerning COVID is encouraging. Hopefully it will continue and this virus will be crushed. I would like nothing better this year to have as our celebration of the Easter message the Easter miracle of the defeat of COVID-19! But dear friends in Christ remember this, the good news of Easter cannot be stopped! Regardless of what the future may hold, Easter will come! Death is defeated! Resurrection and the new life that Jesus brings is our reality!
