

Secretary's roll call was taken.

Secretary's Report: M(Mel Wentzel ~ 2nd Ray Huff) SC: CC: 23.6.1 The secretary's report for the month of May was approved.

Treasurer's Report: M(Helen Schramm ~ 2nd Ray Huff) SC: CC: 23.6.2 The treasurer's report for the month of May (printed 6/12/23) was accepted and filed for audit.

Pastor's report: As submitted by Pastor Vasey.

- Noted that those in need of assistance has been increasing over the past months. Assistance is needed in terms of grocery store (Wegman's) gift cards.
 - * Pastor has initiated a 6 month "wait period" between cards to stretch the limited amount of cards we have. There is also a one card per family limit.
 - * It was suggested that we could advertise in the bulletin asking for donations of Wegman's gift cards or for donations to Pastor's Discretionary Fund.
 - * It was noted that clarification of funds considered in/out funds is being worked on with Jackie Baysore.
- Pastor shared take aways from the Synod Assembly, 2023.
 - * Be intentional with involving children.
 - * Develop a "Prospect List".

- The sexton position has been advertised once again with 2 responses received. Mel will be meeting with one candidate on Tuesday.

- \$1250.00 paid to have the roof inspected. Minor repairs were made where needed and valuable information regarding the roof was given to the committee.
- Waiting for estimate for the Parish Hall roof.
- Front faucet has been repaired.

Safety: Update provided by Herb Poff, liaison

- Next meeting July 10, 2023 at 11:00 AM.
- June 20 meeting to gather information on a possible video surveillance/security system.

Worship and Music: Updated provided by Ray Huff

M(Committee) SC: CC: 23.6.3 Motion approved to bring recommendation to continue with a single service through the year off the table.

- Due to a May absence, Mel Wentzel and Vicki Haussmann were given time to express their thought/opinions on this topic.
- Pros/cons from congregational members were briefly reviewed.
- Concern that the feeling persists that there are "2 congregations" (8:00 and 10:30).

Even if 2 services (as well as online service) continue, we are *one* congregation.

- Thanks to Ray Huff and the Worship and Music Committee for their work on this issue.

M(Shelby Weber ~ 2nd Ray Huff) SC: CC: 23.6.4 Motion approved to vote on single service via a written ballot.

- Mel Wentzel and Vicki Haussmann were appointed tellers for this vote.

Vote Outcome: 3 Yes votes for continuing with a single service, 8 No votes for continuing with a single service. * We will resume with 2 services in the Fall.

Parish Life: Email update provided by Becky Pryor

- 80 sandwiches are prepared every month for New Covenant's Blessing Box.
- Donations of shelf stable packets of tuna salad and chicken salad are needed.
- A funeral luncheon for Roxie Larson will be served on June 22, 2023.

Unfinished Business:

- **Spire Update:** Herb Poff met with an engineer who will be putting together ideas and possibilities for replacing the spire.

 - Scott Gelnett Offer: There is definite council interest in updating our audio-visual equipment. Herb Poff will reach out to Scott Gelnett to let him know.
- Industrial Appraisal Co./Revaluation Services: Deb Buckman is working on this.

M(Shelby Weber ~ 2nd Ray Huff) SC: CC: 23.6.6 Motion approved to cancel July Council meeting noting that any emergent items may need to be discussed/voted on via email.

Shelby Weber led us in the closing prayer.

The meeting was adjourned.

SPECIAL MESSAGE FROM COUNCIL PRESIDENT



Dear Members of St. Mark's -

When St. Mark's Council met in June, among the items on the agenda was to decide whether our congregation should continue to offer two worship services on Sunday morning or move to one. The Council held its discussion and deliberation over the past several months, met with members of the congregation, and revisited all comments offered by members on this issue. By a vote of 8 to 3, it was decided to continue to offer two Sunday worship services, with that schedule being resumed in September.

As we reviewed the comments offered by members of our congregation, it concerned me that several of them implied that St. Mark's has "different congregations" – one that worships at 8 o'clock on Sunday mornings, one that worships at 10:30, and one that worships virtually through our website.

My assurance to you is that St. Mark's is one congregation. Members simply choose to worship at times convenient to them... some like to worship earlier in the day; some prefer to worship later.

It does not matter when we worship because we profess the same Lord. Together, we make our confession. We sing the same hymns of praise. We hear the same scriptures read. Our Pastor brings to us the same message of salvation and hope. We confess the same faith. We receive the same Sacraments – the waters of Baptism and, in the Eucharist, the body and blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. This is what makes the members of St. Mark's one congregation. May it always be so.

I still remember watching the very grainy video of the moon landing. I will have some special LEGO on display in July to celebrate the moon landing, stop by and check it out.

So with history in mind, check out these facts.

The Declaration of Independence was not signed on July 4, 1776. That's actually the day it was formally adopted by the Continental Congress, but it wasn't signed by most signatories until August

Three presidents have died on July 4: Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, and James Monroe

As of 2016, July 4 was the number one holiday for beer sales in the U.S., according to the National Beer Wholesalers Association (this one is for Roxie)

One of the more interesting Apollo 11 facts is that it also held the first religious ritual on the moon. An elder at his Presbyterian Church at the time, crew member Buzz Aldrin was an "elected" elder in the Presbyterian Church and not ordained. Therefore while on the moon he "partook" of holy communion (not performed) consuming previously consecrated bread and wine.

As an homage to the first motor-powered aircraft, the crew brought a piece of wood and fabric from the Wright Flyer inside of their spacecraft. Both the



invention of the Wright Flyer and the Apollo 11 mission were monumental milestones in human flight.

The original Apollo 11, 4 inch patch is worth around \$1,500.00


