On Saturday, January 6, the church celebrates The Epiphany of Our Lord, the adoration of the Wise Men (sometimes referred to as "The Little Christmas"). Epiphany is a Greek word meaning, "Manifestation or Manifest in appearance". This day is called Epiphany because we celebrate that Jesus has been made manifest to the entire world. The wise men were Gentiles, non Jews, who traveled a long distance to worship Jesus as Messiah; the One who bridges the gap between sinners and a holy God. Epiphany proclaims that in Christ no one, no matter what their ancestry or nationality needs to feel estranged or fearful of God. In Christ God comes for all people.

Epiphany begins a season usually overlooked and/or written off by the church. It's the "inbetween" before Lent begins. Like Christmas before it, Epiphany is to be more than one day. It is to usher in a fresh start. It is to stir us to mission activity in the name of Jesus. It helps bring the truth of our faith into focus- Jesus has come for all people. It is no accident that during the Season after the Epiphany we affirm our baptism, that which sets us apart not for privilege but for service. We are a missionary people, set aside for missionary activity, by our missionary God.

- Nine security cameras have been installed around the outside of the building with the main monitor located in the copy room.

Debra Buckman, Treasurer, shared some brief remarks on the 2024 operating budget for St. Mark's Lutheran Church. There was no congregational discussion regarding the 2024 operating budget.

M(Church Council ~ 2nd Mel Wentzel) SC: CC: 23.12.3 Motion to adopt the budget for 2024 to support the ministry of St. Mark's Lutheran Church was approved.

These items may be placed in our red, OCC bin located in the narthex.


