

Whereas, the following named persons, citizens of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, viz: Jacob Weis, Daniel Kleckner, Henry Weigel, Martin Ellinger, George Hartranft, John Rickart, Henry Rickart, Thomas Turke, Peter Alt, and other citizens aforesaid, for the purpose of worshiping Almighty God according to the faith government and discipline of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of the United States of America, and have for that purpose formed a congregation at Williamsport, In the county of Lycoming, Pennsylvania, and now desire to be incorporated agreeably to the provisions of the Act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania, entitled " An Act to confer on certain associations of the citizens of this Commonwealth the powers and immuniteies of corporations or bodies politic in law ", dated April 6th, 1719, and its supplements. Also, of an Act entitled, "An Act relating to Orphans' Court, and for other pumposes", dated October 13th, A.D. 1840, they, therefore declare the following object, articles and conditions of their said association, agreeably to whom they desire to be incorporated

That the said charter amended as aforesaid, so that the same shall read as per above preamble, and as follows: "Which said amendments to charter are within the provisions of the 42nd Section of an Act of the General Assembly, entitled, "An Act for the incorporation and regulation of certain incorporations".

FIRST. The name of the corporation shall be St.Mark's Lutheran Church of Williamsport, Pa.,

SECOND: The church acknowledges itself to be a member of, and belonging to the Evangelical Lutheran Ministerium of Pennsylvania and adjacent states.

THIRD. The business of the corporation is to be transacted in the City of Williamsport, Pa., by a Council of three Trustees and Eight Deacons, lay members thereof, and the Pastor as ex-officio member of council.

FOURTH. All property, real and personal, belonging to said corporation, or which shall hereafter be bequeathed, devised or conveyed to it, shall be taken and held to enure to it, subject to the control and disposition of the lay members thereof, or such constituted officers or representatives thereof as shall be composed of a majority of lay members.


