INTRODUCTION TO TODAY'S READINGS:

Blessings and curses abound on the sixth Sunday after Epiphany. 25"Woe to you who are full now,



***INVITATION TO COMMUNION**

Persons may come forward to the chancel to receive Holy Communion. This format will be more "continuous" noting the following procedure:

- Communicants, masked and observing social distancing, are asked to come forward as directed by ushers by way of the center aisle, take a cup from the tray provided and receive the bread from Pastor Vasey.
- Once receiving the bread, communicants will proceed to one of two stations (left or right) to receive wine from the pouring chalice.
- After receiving wine, communicants will place the empty cup in the designated tray and return to their pew by way of the side aisles.

Please do not kneel at the rail. Kneeling at the rail will return at a time to be determined by pastor and Church Council.

COMMEMORATIONS

Martin Luther, renewer of the church, died 1546

Friday, February 18, 2022

Though he began his adult church life as a simple Augustinian monk, Luther challenged the abuses he saw in the church, and his work eventually led to the Reformation of the Sixteenth Century. Luther's accomplishments included liturgical reform, translation of the Bible, and creation of the Small and Large Catechisms.

WHY "VALENINE'S DAY"?

Valentine's Day is loosely based upon the legend of the Christian Martyr, Valentine, a third century pastor. The story goes that under the rule of the emperor Claudius, Rome was involved in many unpopular and bloody campaigns. The emperor had to maintain a strong army, but was having a difficult time getting soldiers to join his military. Claudius believed that Roman men were unwilling to join the army because of their strong attachment to their wives and families.

To get rid of the problem, Claudius banned all marriages and engagements in Rome. Valentine, realizing the injustice of the decree, defied Claudius and continued to perform marriages for young lovers in secret.

When Valentine's actions were discovered, Claudius ordered that he be put to death. The sentence was carried out on February 14, in or about the year 270. While in jail, Valentine left a farewell note for the jailer's daughter, who had become his friend, and signed it "From Your Valentine."

Centuries after his death the name "Valentine" became attached to romance; it is thought that this came about because February 14 was at one time the Feast Day of a pagan festival of love.

Jesus said, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul and mind...and you neighbor as yourself." That is much more than romance. It is a love that goes above and beyond law and common decency. It is a love that yields to another and treats the other as an extension of the one practicing love.

Valentine took the teaching of Jesus to heart and left us a great example of Christ far deeper than the common vision of candy, cards and flowers. To truly be "My Valentine" is to love the God who first loved us and to love neighbor as ourselves.
