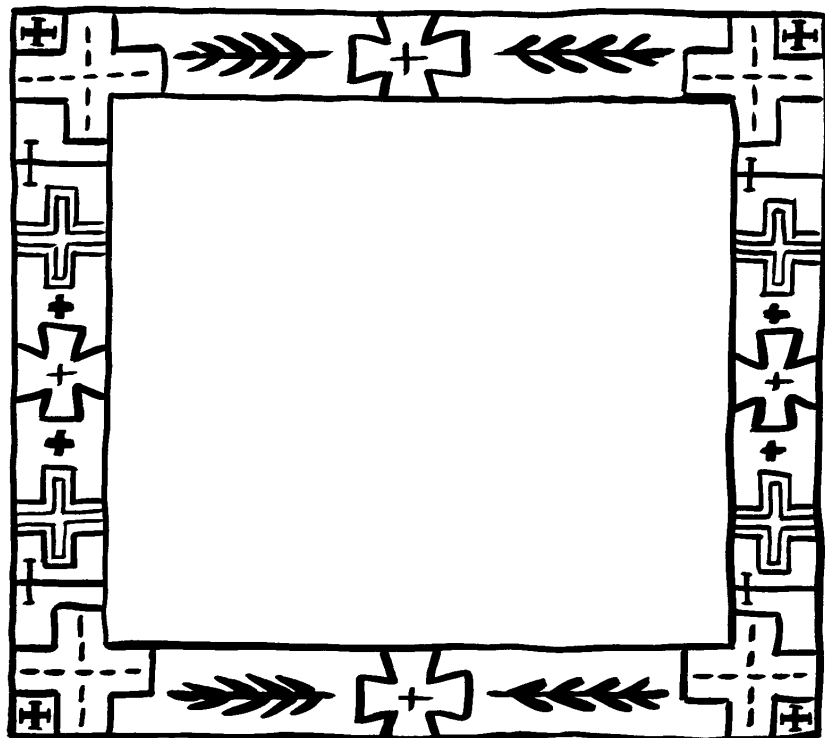


# Send

Tape paper crosses to mirrors in your home.

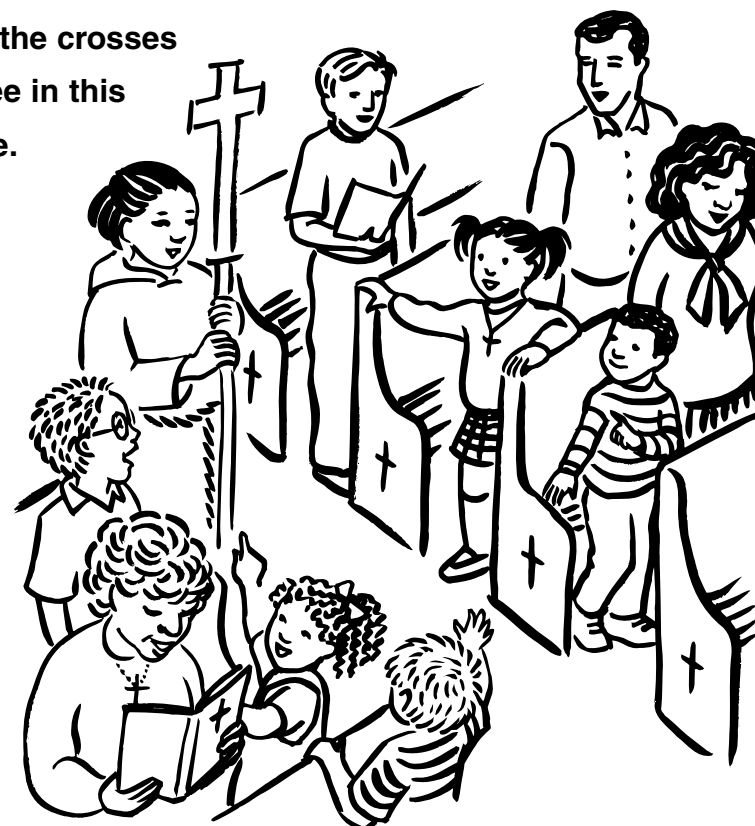
