


Lord, for thy Tender Mercy's Sake

Our anthem today, *Lord, for thy Tender Mercy's Sake,* is by Richard Farrant (1525-1580). Farrant's life is not well-documented, but we do know that he was a successful composer of his day, particularly in the English drama. He is also credited as the first composer to write verse-anthems, a staple of music during the English Reformation. Farrant composed music for the coronation of Mary I and Elizabeth I. *Lord, for thy Tender Mercy's Sake* is perhaps one his most well-known compositions in today's musical world; only a forgiving, merciful God can give us grace, so that we may walk in a perfect heart.
