INTRODUCTION TO TODAY'S READINGS

In the waters of the Jordan, Jesus is revealed as the beloved Son of God. Through this great epiphany, Jesus fulfills all righteousness and becomes the servant of God who will bring forth justice and be a light to the nations. In the waters of baptism we too are washed by the Word, anointed by the Spirit, and named God's beloved children. Our baptismal mission is to proclaim good news to all who are oppressed or in need of God's healing.

AN ORDER FOR INSTALLING MEMBERS OF CHURCH COUNCIL

P Dear Christian friends: Baptized into the priesthood of Christ, we all are called to offer ourselves to the Lord of the Church in Thanksgiving for what he has done and continues to do for us. It is our privilege to recognize and support those who are engaged in the work of this congregation, especially those in the ministry of the Church Congregational Council.

and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen

- P You have been elected to positions of leadership and trust in this congregation. You are to see that the words and deeds of this household of faith reflect Christ in whose name we gather. You are to work together with other members to see that the worship and work of Christ are done in this congregation and that God's will is done in this community and in the whole world. You are to be diligent in your service to the Lord so that the Lord who empowers you is glorified. You are to be examples of faith active in love, to help maintain the life and harmony of this congregation.
- P On behalf of your sisters and brothers in Christ, I ask you: Are you ready to accept and faithfully to execute the duties of the office to which you have been elected? If so please answer, "Yes, by the help of God".






*OUR LORD'S PRAYER

*INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Persons may come forward to the chancel to receive Holy Communion. This format will be more "continuous" noting the following procedure:

- Communicants as directed by ushers are asked to come forward by way of the center aisle, take a cup from the tray provided and receive the bread.
- Once receiving the bread, communicants will proceed to one of two stations (left or right) to receive wine from the pouring chalice.
- After receiving wine, communicants will place the empty cup in the designated tray and return to their pew by way of the side aisles.
