





Persons may come forward to the chancel to receive Holy Communion. This format will be more "continuous" noting the following procedure:

- Communicants as directed by ushers are asked to come forward by way of the center aisle, take a cup from the tray provided and receive the bread.
- Once receiving the bread, communicants will proceed to one of two stations (left or right) to receive wine from the pouring chalice.
- After receiving wine, communicants will place the empty cup in the designated tray and return to their pew by way of the side aisles.
- P All people are called to Christ's table.



# **BLESSING OF THE BACKPACKS**





# **COMMEMORATIONS**



# Dominic, founder of the Order of Preachers (Dominicans), died 1221

Tuesday, August 8, 2023

Dominic was a Spanish priest who saw the wealth of bishops as a stumbling block for the church, so he formed a movement, the Order of Preachers (commonly called Dominicans) devoted to itinerant

preaching and living in poverty.



## Lawrence, deacon, martyr, died 258

Thursday, August 10, 2023

As one of the seven deacons of the church at Rome, Lawrence was responsible for the church's financial matters and for the care of the poor. Asked by the emperor to gather the church's treasure, he presented a collection of orphans, lepers, and the like. The enraged emperor had him put to death.



# Clare, Abbess of San Damiano, died 1253

Friday, August 11, 2023

A contemporary of Francis of Assisi, Clare and a growing number of companions established a women's Franciscan community, called the Order of Poor Ladies, or Poor Clares. She inspired other women to pursue spiritual goals.
