




Blessed are you Lord of heaven and earth. In mercy for our fallen world you gave your only Son, that all those who believe in him should not perish

Hildegard, Abbess of Bingen, died 1179



Sunday, September 17, 2023 A mystic who was widely influential within the church, Hildegard advised and reproved kings and popes, wrote poems and hymns, and produced treatises in medicine, theology, and natural history. She was also a musician and artist.

Dag Hammarskjöld, renewer of society, died 1961 *Monday, September 18, 2023*


A Swedish diplomat, Hammarskjöld served as the second Secretary General of the United Nations until his death in a plane crash while trying to negotiate peace in present-day Zambia. His journal, published as Markings, revealed the depth of his Christian faith.



Nelson Wesley Trout, bishop, died 1996

Wednesday, September 20, 2023

A native of Ohio, Trout served parishes in several parts of the United States before being elected bishop of the South Pacific District of our former American Lutheran Church, the first African American Lutheran to serve in such a capacity.



Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist

Thursday, September 21, 2023 Matthew (or Levi) was a tax collector in Capernaum for the Roman government. Tax collectors were frequently despised for dishonesty and for assisting the occupiers. Jesus

nevertheless showed love for them, and chose Matthew to be a disciple.
