




our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying:

- Once receiving the bread, communicants will proceed to one of two stations (left or right) to receive wine from the pouring chalice.
- After receiving wine, communicants will place the empty cup in the designated tray and return to their pew by way of the side aisles.

# ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING



# **COMMEMORATIONS**

## Andrew, Apostle



*Thursday, November 30, 2023* The first of the apostles to be called by Jesus, Andrew quickly began to bring others to the Savior, including Simon Peter. The Bible also shows him leading some Greeks to meet Jesus, and he brought forward the boy with five loaves and two fish, with which Jesus fed thousands. According to tradition Andrew was executed on this day dying on an X shaped cross.
