THE SERMON

LBW, "Green", 36 ***HYMN** On Jordan's Banks the Baptist's Cry ***THE NICENE CREED** Living together in trust and hope, we confess our faith: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all there is, seen and unseen. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.He has spoken through the prophets.We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins.We look for the resurrection of the dead,and the life of the world to come. Amen
