INTRODUCTION TO TODAY'S WORSHIP



He ascended into heaven,







- The Christmas ornaments crafted by Lou Ann Zeigler brought joy to many. To date, \$190.00 has been donated. That joy, given as \$15 grocery gift cards, will be shared with clients of the United Churches Food Pantry.
- The Faith Formation and Evangelism and Fellowship Committees thank the congregation for participating in Reverse Advent. The contents of the Advent bags will be sorted and delivered to Liberty House at the YWCA.

These gestures of Christmas spirit given by members of our congregation were certain to comfort the individuals receiving them in Christ's name.

P.S. Now is the perfect time to pack up those holiday decorations you no longer need and donate them to the annual Fall Sale.


Christmas Clean-Up


