




Lift up your hearts.






Perpetua and Felicity and companions, martyrs at Carthage, died 202



Thursday, March 7, 2024 Vibia Perpetua, a noblewoman, and Felicity, an enslaved woman, were catechumens at Carthage, northern Africa. They, with four other catechumens, had defied the Roman emperor who had forbidden conversions to Christianity, and were put to death in the amphitheater.
