INTRODUCTION TO TODAY'S WORSHIP

Today we follow Christ from triumphal entry to the cross, each waypoint of the journey marked by Jesus' compassion for those who would betray, mock, accuse, or do violence to him. Though persecuted and beaten, Jesus the Son of God is not disgraced; instead, he asks forgiveness for those who put him to death. We have walked the Lenten pathway these forty days, each of us invited through baptism to "let the same mind be in us that was in Christ Jesus." We enter this holy week accompanying Jesus to the cross with both grief and thanksgiving in our hearts, trusting in God's redeeming love.

PRELUDE

WELCOME/INTRODUCING THE DAY/ANNOUNEMENTS

*THE TRIUMPHAL ENTRY (Luke 19:28-40)

Blessed is the One who comes in the name of the Lord!

Hosanna in the highest!

28 After he had said this, [Jesus] went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem.

29 When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, 30 saying, "Go into the village ahead

of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. 31 If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it.' "32 So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. 33 As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" 34 They said, "The Lord needs it." 35 Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. 36 As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. 37 As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, 38 saying,

"Blessed is the king

who comes in the name of the Lord!

Peace in heaven,

and glory in the highest heaven!"

39 Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, order your disciples to stop." 40 He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out."


Lift up your hearts.

Do this for the remembrance of me.

*OUR LORD'S PRAYER




but deliver us from evil.

PLEASE JOIN US on Friday, April 18 (Good Friday) in the Nave at 7:30 pm for the Drama, "The Temptation of Jesus," by the Rev. Curt M. Joseph. The drama imagines a conversation between Jesus and Satan while Jesus is being crucified. The character of

Satan "tries his best" to convince Jesus to come down from the cross and end his suffering and execution. Jesus remains steadfast and answers the devil's temptation with the traditional seven last words from the cross. The drama's message is a powerful one and seeks to remind us that (1) temptations were part of the life of Christ, (2) we can only "overcome" temptations when we rely on God in Christ, and (3) Satan and temptations come to us in many and various forms and nuances.

Olavus Petri, pastor, died 1552; Laurentius Petri, Bishop of Uppsala, died 1573; renewers of the church

These two brothers studied with Luther at the University of Wittenberg and then returned to their native Sweden to introduce the Lutheran reforms. Olavus published a catechism and hymnal; Laurentius was a professor who defended the office of bishop and later became one.
