The best way for each of us to honor parents and grandparents and all our forebears in the faith is by taking seriously our responsibility to tell Good News to someone else.

Here are a few ideas to get us all thinking:

- ♦ Invite a friend or neighbor to come to Sunday worship with you.
- Review the basics and expand your thought and knowledge through one of the adult Sunday School classes, The Way, the Wednesday noon Bible study, the 6:31 AM Thursday study group... or ask that another group be started at another time of the week.
- Share a meal-time prayer at your home when you invite friends in, and encourage conversation springing from it.
- Remind children that when they have overnight guests on Saturday that they are also then invited to go with your family to church and Sunday School on Sunday morning.
- When you notice someone you do not know at church, introduce yourself and offer to sit nearby; they may appreciate that someone notices, they may appreciate clues about local customs
- Do something, say something, sing something, be something positive to someone in the name of Christ, and the Holy Spirit will make happen what God wills out of it.

The best way for each of us to honor parents and grandparents and all our forebears in the faith is by taking seriously our responsibility to tell Good News to someone else.



St. Mark's Women Fall Bazaar



United Campus Ministry

As the end of a busy semester approaches, and with graduation in sight for two of our students, we have taken time out to focus on Lent. One of the first activities we did was to walk the labyrinth that was set up at Trinity Episcopal Church. It was a quiet time of reflection and prayer for us. A labyrinth is a spiritual tool to help us become closer to God. It took us through twists and turns which are metaphors for our individual faith journeys. When the path led us to the outer edges of the labyrinth, we were reminded how at times we feel very far from our destination and far from God. As we headed back toward the center again, we became more aware of not only God's presence in our lives, but also of his power. As we prayed and walked back out of the labyrinth, it was a reminder to us to go out into the world to face our daily challenges, knowing that God was with us. The labyrinth served as a much needed time of meditation for the students. I also felt the rejuvenated from this quiet, meaningful, prayer walk.

A few students and I also attended the Seder Meal that was held at St. Mark's Lutheran Church. "I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate." (Romans 7:15, NRSV)

A recent posting on Facebook really brought to my attention, the broad impact that Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD) and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) have on daily life. The individual shared a recent article by John O'Neil titled, *Learning to Drive with ADHD* (www.nytimes.com/2012/03/27/health) In the article, the author cites a 2007 study by Russell A Barkley of the Medical University of S.C. and Daniel J Cox of the University of VA Health System, which indicates that young drivers with ADHD are "two to four times as likely as those without the condition to have an accident, meaning that they are at a higher risk of wrecking the car than an adult who is legally drunk". Researchers say that many teenagers with attention or learning problems can become good drivers, but not easily or quickly, and that some will be better off not driving until they are older – or not at all." They go on to say that, "When a driver takes his eyes off the road for two seconds or more, he's doubled the risk of a crash." With both ADD and ADHD, often come distractibility, impulsivity and risk-taking. Add to all this, the distractions from within the vehicle, by stereos, cell phones and passengers, and you've got the recipe for problems.

There are numerous things parents can do to help their child with ADD or ADHD ease into learning to drive. It begins by honestly assessing the maturity of your child – have there been ongoing behavior problems or multiple instances of poor judgment? If your child is very oppositional or defiant, he/she probably should not be driving. Other considerations include:

- Has he/she had medical treatment the study's authors go so far as to propose that "medication should not really be optional".
- Schedule an eye exam; does he/she have problems with visual processing?
- Give serious consideration to formal one-to-one driver training, and recognize that this training should take as long as necessary for the learner to develop confidence – plan for more than the 40-50 hours set by the state.
- Parents should also seek coaching tips from the trainer, since mom or dad will be handling the bulk of the child's training time.

Let your teen know that driving is a privilege, not a right, and that the privilege goes hand-in-hand with safe driving skills. Although the state may not take away this privilege, you will not hesitate to do so if you feel his/her driving is unsafe. In addition:

- ♦ Make sure that the driver knows the route needed to get to his/her destination.
- Solution Discourage driving during peak times such as rush-hour and after dark.
- Solution Limit passengers to one friend, and confine it to a friend that you trust to not become a distraction.
- \diamond No eating while behind the wheel.
- If you cannot get your teen to agree to not listen to music while driving, set the expectation that he/she pick one CD or radio station before putting the car in gear and that no changes will take place until the car is stopped.
- Solution Instead of eliminating the cell phone, make sure it is turned off, and is out of reach put it in the trunk.

Above all, model good driving habits, and begin discussing driving skills before your child comes of age. ADD and ADHD are chronic issues that follow us into adulthood, and according to The Association for

Driver Rehabilitation Specialists, may be manifested by: not properly observing signs/signals – slowness in responding to traffic lights – slowing/stopping on green or going on red; failure to yield the right-of-way; drifting from the lane of traffic; fluctuating or inappropriate speeds; impaired eye/hand/foot coordination and, the inability to focus or deal with distractions while driving.

Getting a driver's license is a huge milestone for most teens. Celebrate the occasion by asking your pastor or priest to offer a "blessing of the keys" for all new drivers in the congregation, and get into the habit of saying a prayer for safe travel with every click of the seatbelt


