

The Congregation Council met in regular session on May 20 in the Crossways room. The Council:

- elected officers for the year: Ray Huff, president; Gregg Dancho, vice-president; Shelby Weber, secretary; Wanda Fortin, treasurer.
- received the regular reports of the Pastor, committees, and officers.
- moved to accept a new member Audrey Commerford by Letter of Transfer from St Paul Lutheran Church, Scottdale PA., and to be received in worship on June 2.
- approved the occasional use of Fellowship Hall for the testing of pet therapy dogs in a controlled environment for service in hospitals, nursing homes, etc. when such use does not conflict with other scheduled activities.
- affirmed the bid solicited by the Property Committee for seal-coating the east parking lot and St. Mark's Place for \$3,460 by M&M Paving.
- affirmed the use of Zeigler memorial money for the purchase of an ice machine for the kitchen.
- had a second reading of the nave usage policy and more discussion.
- noted that installation of new council members will be Sunday 5/26 at either service.
- set the next regular Council meeting for August 19; if matters arise in the meantime, a special meeting may be called to follow Sunday worship.



The Adventures of Donna in France

Donna Elkin is currently in France, where daughter Katy and her group *Le Tendre* Amour are preparing a Baroque opera *Don Quixote.* The following are selected portions of various emails from her.

The first email I wrote was on a French computer. You haven't lived until you have tried to type English with a French spell check. It kept changing my words to something that looked French. What a fight that was. Flying to France takes only about 9 hours, but total transit time was more than 24 hours. While driving to the airport we had to stop to pick up a shawm and sopranino recorder from the office of Piffaro, a renaissance band, in downtown Philadelphia.

On a flight to Europe, you lose 6 hours, so that when my flight landed at 7 a.m. in Geneva, Switzerland, it was only 1 a.m. in the U.S. But I wasn't finished traveling yet! After going through customs, I had to find my trains to Lyon, France. First there was a short train ride from the airport to the train station in Geneva. But where was the information desk? Uh, oh, there isn't any! Even though I had my ticket, it didn't say which track to take. So, I wandered down to the tracks and asked if anyone there spoke English. Lucky me, I met a French lady who had been living in California. She was able to help me get on the right train. We rode together until it was time for me to get off and find the next train. This time I asked a policeman who introduced me to the conductor. I got on the right train then, which would be 2 hours at high speed to Lyon. Since I arrived 2 hours earlier than planned, I needed to call my daughter who would meet me. But how to do that? By luck I saw an office called SOS travelers. One person spoke English there. He called my daughter and was very relieved to find that she spoke French. They worked out where she could meet me and then took me to a waiting area. In a few minutes he came back to tell me he had forgotten to tell her which rail station in Lyon! But he assured me that when he returned to work next week, he would look to see if I were still waiting. Thankfully Katy found me there about 45 minutes later. We took trams and metros to Bron, then walked for 15 minutes to her house, Maison des Artes. This is where the artists performing at the summer festival in Bron live and will be my home for the next six weeks. It was 2 p.m., or 8 a.m. in Pennsylvania, 26 hours of adventure on the road.

The opera will be performed daily from June 15 until August 3. The opera is part of a 6-hour evening at the Fort Bron Festival, an every other year event which includes other acts and dinner. Right now the production is in rehearsal all day long for 5 days a week. That is when I have the fun of babysitting my grandson. He likes to play in the park near our house but it looks like rain is in the forecast so it will be inside play for the next week.

Picture a castle hidden by forest, surrounded by a moat, and entered across a draw-bridge. Today I was writing a fanfare to begin the program. It will be played by sackbut and flugelhorn, with all the other performers joining the heraldic music on toy instruments. The people coming to the show will be outside the castle until the appointed hour of 6 p.m., when the fanfare sounds and the iron gate across the bridge opens dramatically. Inside they will find a fair, with all kinds of acts and offerings that would have been at a fair in 1743. Trapeze artists on wire and filmy cloths, a juggler selling fruits from his wagon and juggling the produce, a large toy donkey giving patrons a tour around the fair, a seller of elixir that cures all ills, a fortune teller, instrumental musicians playing shawm, bagpipe, hurdy-gurdy, drums, gong, and many more acts. After an hour the patrons are called to choose among four skits from the story of Don Quixote (this name is spelled differently in French, Spanish, and English). Since the language of the evening is French, I will be studying the scripts before attending, although the acting is so good, that you can easily figure out what is going on. After the skits, the patrons are ushered to dinner, while the opera performers hurry off to get into their elaborate Baroque costumes that are being made especially for this performance. Yes, I will be getting one also, even though my only duties are at the beginning. During dinner some actors will be the waiters, so that the experience will be much more than 'service with a smile.'

These nine have met with their families and mentors (Diana, Jane, Chele, Donna, Michele, Ray, Lou, Bob, and Gary) the third Sunday of every month since September, studying the gospel according to Luke and exploring different aspects of worship, prayer and service, as well as doing some service projects with their mentors.

Come and learn what it is like to be a homeless family, work together as a team to find a way through our Low Ropes Course, earn "money" for your "family" by competing in our Basketball Free Throw Challenge, try your hand or foot at the Hoola Hoop Game, all while learning about some great community resources. If I have missed anyone's outstanding achievement it is the fault of someone who did not let me know so please keep me in the loop!




