Items needed for these kits are listed on handout sheets in the Narthex.

All kits and soap bars are due in September.

Won't you share our incredible blessings with those less fortunate?

Fabric Kit

2 pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (no knits or 100% polyester). Each piece should match one of the sizes below:

2¼ yards of 60" wide fabric, or
3 yards of 44" wide fabric, or
4 yards of 36" wide fabric



2 spools of neutral-colored all purpose thread, 250-300 yards

Fabric should have no stains or holes. Pieces do not need to match in size or color/pattern. Fold thread and one piece of fabric inside second fabric piece and tie with yarn, sturdy string, ribbon or a strip of fabric.



Personal Care Kit 1 light-weight bath-size towel (max. 52" X 27"), dark color

2 bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of soap, any brand, wrapped 1 adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging

1 sturdy comb, remove packaging

1 metal nail clippers - remove packaging

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Wrap all the items in the towel and tie securely with ribbons or yarn.



4 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper approximately 8" X 101/2"; no loose-leaf paper

1 30-centimeter ruler, or with centimeters and inches

1 pencil sharpener

1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

5 unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

School Kit

- 5 black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band 1 box of 16 or 24 crayons
- $1 \ 2^{1/2}$ " eraser

1 sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14" X 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new & in good condition. Remove any excess packaging, pack all items in bag and close.

Layette Kit

- 2 lightweight cotton t-shirts
- 2 long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- 2 receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square
- 4 cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- 1 jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- 2 pairs of socks
- 2 bars of gentle soap (4-5 oz bars)
- 1 hand towel, dark color wrapped
- 2 diaper pins or large safety pins



Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. Gently used, clean items (no stains or tears) or new. Wrap items in one of the receiving blankets and secure with diaper pins.

Charitable Contributions Deduction

Would you still support your church if there was no tax deduction for your gift? That's a decision many donors may have to make if the latest proposal from House Ways and Means Committee Chairman Dave Camp becomes law. The proposal is for a 2% floor for all charitable donations similar to the 10% floor (7 ½% for those over 65) on the deduction for medical expenses. For example, if your total income is \$50,000. You would only be able to deduct charitable contributions that exceed \$1,000 (\$50,000 X 2%).

President Obama also wants to limit charitable donations but only for wealthier donors. The President wants to limit tax savings on charitable donations to 28%. Only taxpayers in brackets greater than 28% would be affected. The 31% tax bracket begins for married couples whose income exceeds \$223,050 this year.

Some believe Representative Camp's proposal would hurt middle income taxpayers. He disagrees. His plan would increase the standard deduction to \$22,000 for a married couple filing jointly (currently \$12,400). Many taxpayers would no longer need to itemize under this plan. Only those taxpayers with higher incomes would lose some of their charitable deductions due to the 2% threshold if they itemize.

Representative Camp's tax plan would also give taxpayers until April 15th of the following year to give to charities. This is similar to the current deadline for contributing to an IRA. Allowing the extension would make it easier to know whether taxpayers have reached that 2% floor and need to accelerate contributions. Representative Mike Kelly of Pennsylvania likes the idea of extending the deadline for charitable contributions. He has introduced a standalone bill to put the extension into law without the other tax law changes.

Still others believe a 2% floor could actually encourage giving. As a taxpayer nears the floor, they may give more to get over the threshold. Many charitable donations are given to a church or synagogue. This type of giving may not be motivated by tax deductions. In fact, the vast majority of Americans say taxes are not the main reason for their decision to give to a charity^{*}. However, they do like the charitable deduction. A 2011 USA Today/Gallup Poll found that 71% of people opposed eliminating the charitable deduction.

The charitable deduction costs the government about \$44 billion a year in lost revenue. Any serious attempt at tax reform will have to reduce or reform the deduction. Camp's objective is to limit deductions in order to lower overall tax rates. He believes a better code will produce a better economy and result in \$2.2 billion more in annual contributions to charity.
