

And now for some good news!

Family Promise brings about change both for St. Mark's and for the families involved. Did you know that almost every person who has been a guest at St. Mark's has not come for a second visit. Have you wondered what has happened next with them?



Today as we write, it is one week before our guests arrive and we are only expecting one family, a father and his 4 year old son. What a difference from last November when we had a full house – four families! By next week when our hosting begins, there may be more guests, since Family Promise gets many applications each week. Not everyone who applies qualifies or is able to enter the program, and those who do begin with *Family Promise* must pledge to work to improve their situation.

Here is some information we have received from the *Family Promise* office about some of the families we hosted in November, plus one other family from earlier times:

- + Family 1 was Mom and 3 small children. She was working when she came in and continued to work throughout her stay. She was out in 30 days and into her own place. She is doing well.
- + Family 2 came in as a group, Grandparents, daughter and grandson. Both Mom and Grandpa maintained employment. Mom and son were able to move in 59 days and Grandparents went in 71. They got into separate apartments, still maintain their employment and seem to be doing well.
- + Family 3 of Mom, Dad and 3 children were out in 72 days. When they came to us, the family was not intact at all. The one daughter was living on her own. Parents and teenagers were not speaking to each other, and neither of the girls was enrolled in school. Throughout their stay, they all enrolled in counseling, both girls got into cyber school, one daughter got a job and the other is due to have her baby any day. Dad got a job working for a local landlord as the maintenance man and part of the deal was an apartment. They had their share of ups and downs getting to this point, but they are actually living as a family now, going to their appointments and doing good things.
- + As for some of the earlier graduates: one in particular stands out. She had 4 children and no high school education. She did not think she was smart enough to do it. She struggled a lot in the program but by the end of it, she had completed her GED, secured a job and moved into her own place. Since then, she has continued in school, and now is in the last semester of her Bachelor program in college. The kids are extremely active in sports and she is right there as their personal cheerleader. She is doing a great job and continues to do positive things.

Thank you to all our volunteers. With out the contribution of time, goods, and service from each of you, we would not be able to do this blessed work.

IRON CHEF



The competition between St. Mark's Lutheran Church and this year's challenger, St. John Lutheran Church, JS, begins at 5:00 P.M., Sunday, March 1, 2015, in Fellowship Hall, at St. Mark's Lutheran Church, 142 Market St., Williamsport.

An appetizing dinner will be served to all those making reservations through St. Mark's at 570-323-4619. Once the meal has been served, the cooking challenge begins.

St. Mark's team, headed by Pastor Kenneth Elkin, face off against the St. John team, led by Pr. Kerry Auker. In order for all those present to view the event, the contest will be projected on the large screen on stage. (It will also be streamed live on the web at http://www.ustream.tv/channel/iron-chef-williamsport <u>Iron Chef Williamsport</u> www.ustream.tv for those unable to attend.)

Last year, a drawing was added at the beginning of the event whereby the owner of the lucky ticket was invited to sit at the judges table and enjoy the efforts of the teams! It went over very well—especially with the winner—and we will be doing it again this year About 75% of the \$30 ticket cost will go directly to Family Promise of Lycoming County. This is very exciting, as Family Promise has now been up and running for five years!

Thirteen congregations, with the help of many other supporting churches, have hosted over 89 families to date and many volunteers help at the day center! Those families consisted of 297 people, 205 of whom were children. As of one year ago, FPLC had supplied 11,991 nights of shelter (per person per night) which would have cost \$222,000! Over 900 volunteers, county-wide, are giving their time to this ministry! Your funding goes to supply and maintain the day center, pay for insurance, fuel the van, and compensate our directors of the program!

If you cannot attend (or even if you can!), you can become a patron of this event in support of Family Promise of Lycoming County. We will place patrons in the *a la carte* listing (\$1 - \$49), the *cordon bleu* listing (\$50 - \$99), the *haute cuisine* listing (\$100 and more), and the *restaurateur* listing (\$180 and more) of our program. Please contact St. Mark's regarding your donation.

In the past five years, St. Mark's has raised \$30,000+ for FPLC! Please join them as they defend the title, Iron Chef Williamsport, in this seventh annual competition. Whether you're cheering for them, for St. John or for Family Promise—they'd love to see you there!

Pastor Kerry Aucker of St. John's Lutheran in Jersey Shore is organizing a meal packaging event on Saturday, April 11, 2015 in Jersey Shore. 

Pastor Exchange Prior to Iron Chef Williamsport

As part of the preparation for the annual Iron Chef Williamsport competition, Pastor Elkin will be trading places with pastor Kerry Aucker of St. John Lutheran Church, Jersey Shore on Sunday February 1.

This is the first time that the church who is being challenged is a Lutheran congregation, and so it is especially appropriate that we get to know the pastoral leader of one of our sister parishes. Pastor Aucker was ordained in 1993, has earned the D. Min degree in recent years, and has been serving in the St. John congregation for 16 years, as well as being Dean of the West Branch Conference.
