

Reconciliation Update

It has been a full year since the Reconciliation Panel presented its report and recommendations to the Congregation Council. The Council agreed not to disclose the contents of these documents, but to move ahead in implementing the recommendations. So things have been quietly happening in the background since then.

We have divided the responsibilities of Mutual Ministry and Personnel into two separate committees, and each of them has a number of tasks. Mutual Ministry is studying the synod's handbook on its functions: Personnel is dealing ful



istry is studying the synod's handbook on its functions; Personnel is dealing fully and carefully with several important personnel issues, and is also rewriting and expanding the personnel handbook. These committees will also be taking up several other tasks this summer such as a policies and procedures book, reviewing the jobs descriptions of all of our committees, and revising our staff evaluation process. All of this work gradually is coming back to the full Council for its review.

The Council has reviewed its roles and responsibilities, and will do so again in several months to make sure we are on track. The Council also has developed a new mission statement for the parish.

In June we will be inviting the Panel to return and lead the Council in a goal-setting process.

Thanks again to all those who gave their observations to the Panel last year. They served as the background for the panel as it formulated its recommendations. We're making progress as together we *Know Christ and make Christ known*.




Register Now for Camp! We are gearing up for our summer camping season for 2015 and are accepting registrations for all programs until they are filled. This year's camping season will begin on June 14, 2015. Resident and Day Camps run until August 16. There are programs for all ages from kindergarten to senior high, adults, and families. Most sessions run for one week, but there are also half-week, day-only, and ten day sessions. 
