Mid-Day, Mid-Week Prayers .. December 2, 9, 16, 23, 11:30 AM...

In addition to our familiar seasonal activities, one new one has been added this year. All those who are available in the middle of the day are invited to gather for Mid -Day Prayers on the four Wednesdays of Advent, December 2, 9, 16, and 23, in the Chapel. The prayer office is similar to what we use at midday during Lent, a simple service with hymns, lessons and prayers with a brief exposition of a particular topic or passage. This year our subject will be "What Good News the Advent Hymns teach."

Since many of our gatherings involve food, this will be no exception! We'll plan on light lunch fare; soup, bread, and something sweet. The first week will feature Caldo Gallego, a hearty sausage/bean/potato soup which Pr. Elkin learned to appreciate very much in northern Spain. For Thought and Action...

The author of our Crossways Bible Study series, Dr. Harry Wendt, recently wrote: "I have traveled to Slovakia several times to conduct seminars in Bible colleges in Bratslava (its capital city) and in Martin. During one of those visits, a pastor shared with me how the Communists who ruled the Eastern Block countries for four decades after World War II set about destroying the Church. They told the Christian community:

"We will never try to stop you from going to church. Go to church every Sunday. Listen to those sermons. But remember this: There are to be no Bible study groups, no prayer groups, no Sunday schools, no youth groups. Just go to church and listen to those sermons. And all sporting events for children and youth are to be held on Sunday mornings!



"He assured me that this strategy succeeded in all but destroying the Church. Sad to say, what the Communists imposed on people living in Eastern Block countries is what many people in the West embrace as the norm. They believe that being a Christian means listening to a sermon once in a while. But involvement in Bible study? Not necessary!"

SafeChurch Facilitator Training

During the third week of October, Donna Clark and Bernadette Jones participated in a three-day training seminar provided by Samaritan Counseling Center in Lancaster. While there, they met with others of different faith backgrounds, but all had one goal: providing a safe environment for our children.

The training began at 8:15 each morning and ended at 5:00 pm, with a one-hour lunch break. Morning and afternoon sessions focused on different aspects of Child Sexual Abuse and its impacts, adult survivors and healing, sexual offenders and the "grooming" process, mandated reporting, responding to disclosures, pastoral care of victims and offenders, making our facility safer, policy development, and spiritual issues (including forgiveness).

It was informative, emotional, spiritual, and not a little overwhelming for them. There was "homework" each evening...the first night composing a theological framing statement for our protection policy, the second



night was writing a paper about the urgency of people of faith becoming leaders in the preventing child sexual abuse.

During the coming year, they will be calling on the people of St. Mark's to make a commitment to dealing with this issue.

A team of 3-6 people will need to commit to attending six training sessions with teams from other congregations. A committee dedicated solely to child protection will need to be put in place.

As Lutherans, we are called on to "...faithfully care for them (the children) and help them in every way as God gives opportunity..." This quote is from the LBW in the service for Holy Baptism. Many will probably feel that St. Mark's does not have this problem and, therefore, doesn't need to get this involved. But, as Luke 12:48 says, "...to whom much is given, much shall be required..."


