# Anniversary Celebration

What an interesting way to celebrate an anniversary! Nineteen of St. Mark's youth and young adults gathered on Sunday evening, April 10, at the invitation of Pastor Elkin, to help him celebrate twenty years of service at St. Mark's. It was a chance to thank the youth for all of their diligent work together with the Pastor across the years. The youth serve at worship, serve at table, and serve in many other age-appropriate activities in the

parish. They responded positively to this opportunity to enjoy one of our famous food-related events without having to lift a dish or fetch a plate.

We began with appetizers in the conversation area, with fruit salsa and tortilla chips, borekas (a small cheese-filled puff pastry popular with kids in Israel), and candied bacon. Then the group moved to the tables and were served a cold mango fruit soup with cinnamon straws. The main course was turkey-filled ravioli in a sage cream sauce with red pepper and yellow pepper garnish sauces. Also offered were green bean bundles and tangzhong-style Japanese milk rolls. The dessert was a very dramatic production of flaming bananas Foster or cherries jubilee served over ice cream in a deepfried crepe painted with chocolate. The kitchen staff was headed by Ed Barone, who organized the meal with our folks who have participated in the Iron Chef competition over the past seven years: Bernadette Jones, Ruth Rees, Todd Smith, Gary Weber, Kathy Eshelman, and the Pastor. Lou DeSeau and Michele Owen did yeoman work with dishes and cleanup.

Since our youth have often presented something musical at events, we thought it was only fair that the adults present something musical for the youth at this event. Donna Zierdt Elkin and Ken Schreckengast, horns; Laura Schreckengast and Karen Boone, clarinets; and Pastor Elkin, bassoon played two selections familiar to instrumentalists in the audience. And then Deb Buckman, Nick Buckman, Karen Boone, Laura Schreckengast, Donna Zierdt Elkin and Pastor Elkin sang the famous and humorous "Banquet Fugue" by the English composer John Rutter. We closed with everyone joining in "Happy Birthday" for Taylor and Sadie Wentzel.

What an evening! Thanks to all who made it possible, and to the youth who gave us the reason.

# **Prayer Chain**



## 40,000 + Meals to End Hunger!

April 1, 2016 at Messiah Lutheran Church was the latest meal packaging event in Lycoming County in which folks from St. Mark's have participated. Fifteen members donned gloves and hairnets to measure, pour, weigh and seal thousands of meals of fortified macaroni and cheese. Other St. Mark's members donated the desserts and paper products used to serve the 270 people who attended that evening. Additionally we donated \$77.00 toward the cost of packaging the meals.

All meals remain in Lycoming County to help those who are experiencing food insecurity.

## YOUTH & FAMILY MINISTRY



We have amazing youth at St. Mark's! Do you realize all that they do? In addition to their weekly commitment during wor-

ship as acolytes, cantors, instrumentalists, assistant minister, and ushers, many of our youth show up on a monthly basis as good examples for our littles—helping with Children's Church, with Confirmation, and participating in/helping cleanup from 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday events. Quarterly, they assist with Family Promise hosting week—with preparations or as hosts, themselves. They have their ongoing mission for Heifer International (Project Heifer) for which they hold fundraisers, preparing and serving meals for all who wish to donate. All total, they have donated over \$2500 to Project Heifer.

In addition to all of that (yes, there's more!), they participate in the CROP Walk, pack gifts for Operation Christmas Child, go caroling, help decorate the Nave for Christmas, collect for Souper Bowl Sunday, and are of major assistance with the July 4<sup>th</sup> outreach.

Then there are the meals and milestone celebrations which we couldn't do without them (for which they serve and clean up): the September congregational breakfast, Advent wreath making, Kids' Night Out, Hobby Day, Iron Chef Williamsport (that's a biggie), Seder, Breakfast with Pastor/Easter Egg Hunt (for which they also cook), Women's Dinner, and the church picnic.

And let's not forget their participation in "A Christmas Carol," the Christmas pageants, and special event small ensembles—not to mention the huge one: a one-week commitment every year for Vacation Bible School!

Now, on Mother's Day, May 8, they're at it again! Council has asked them to step up for a special <u>Youth Service</u> and those whose families didn't have plans have done so. 13 youth are participating in the 10:30 service that day, filling all the adult roles except for those of pastor and organist, as well as providing art for the bulletin.

The plate offering that day will go toward their Project Heifer fundraising effort.

There will be an extended hospitality showing our appreciation of them in Fellowship Hall after the service.
