

SUMMER FILM SERIES FOR ADULTS AND YOUTH

Beginning Sunday, June 12, we will begin a film with discussion series at 10:45, after the 9:30 service. We hope to cover three, very different films during the summer months, showing a part of a film each Sunday, followed by discussion. Bernadette and Michele will lead these sessions and they hope that ALL ages (middle school and up) will join in the discussion. All the films are very current, beginning with:



- Patterns of Evidence EXODUS, a documentary about new archaeological findings and theories believed to be relevant to the biblical story of the Exodus of the Hebrew slaves from Egypt as depicted in the Book of Exodus. The film is very engaging and easy to follow—we hope to have an interesting discussion on this one.
- 2. <u>WOODLAWN:</u> Following government-mandated desegregation in 1973, Tony Nathan joins fellow African-American students at Woodlawn High School in Birmingham, Ala. As violence and anger erupt in the city, Woodlawn football coach Tandy Gerelds allows an outsider to



speak to his players. His message of hope and love leads to a spiritual awakening that inspires star athlete Nathan, his teammates and other members of the community to overcome the hate that surrounds them. It would be interesting to have our older participants relate what it was like, living in the 70's when this was going on in the south.



3. <u>RISEN</u>: Roman military tribune Clavius remains set in his ways after serving 25 years in the army. He arrives at a crossroad when he's tasked to investigate the mystery of what happened to Jesus following the Crucifixion. Accompanied by trusted aide Lucius, his quest to disprove rumors of a risen Messiah makes him question his own beliefs and spirituality. As his journey takes him to places never dreamed of, Clavius discovers the truth that he's been seeking. Just released this year, this is a fascinating "what if.." film, hopefully engendering a lively conversation.



It has been a few years since we last had a lock-in for our youth: many of them have been asking for another opportunity to participate in one.


Guess what? We've scheduled one! Just before the time our youth begin practices for school activities and right about the time their parents might need a break!


