## Our Community Celebrated!



#### **Celebrating Independence Day with St. Mark's**

An Independence Day tradition continues. St. Mark's again hosted a front lawn party on July 4, as part of a city-wide celebration of Independence Day. Everyone who passed the church was offered free food, drink and trinkets by one of many volunteers along the street.

The word on the street appears to be that St. Mark's is the place to be on Independence Day, even in the rain! Church volunteers were busy setting up tables and then manning those tables, the popcorn machine and the grill from 4:30 until dark when it was then time for the fireworks.

#### How much did the revelers consume.....

- Hundreds of bottles of water and more than 160 cans of soda
- Gallons of lemonade and ice tea
- 210 packages of salty snacks
- Pounds and pounds of candy and fruit snacks
- 350 bags of popcorn
- 350 hot dogs (maybe more because folks would ask for one without a bun)

Our organist Jungwha Kim, with assistance from several congregation members, presented a patriotic program in our nave with more than 130 people enjoying the presentation and participating in singing along. Nick Buckman brought in sound equipment to broadcast the radio simulcast to the crowd outside during the fireworks.

#### People donated \$265.00 to St. Anthony's Center.

Thanks to the Pepsi Bottling Company of Williamsport for donating cases of soda and water and to Sam's Club for donating snacks and corn popping supplies. Thanks also to Church Council and the congregation for financially supporting the event and donating additional supplies. Please take one (or more) and fill it during the summer with the school supplies listed below. School supplies are beginning to go on sale now.

You can make a difference in the lives of children in impoverished schools or refugee camps.

Other types of kits are also being requested.

You can make up a Personal Care Kit, a Baby Care Kit, or a Fabric Kit.

Items needed for these kits are also listed on handout sheets in the Narthex.

Soap bars (in the original wrappings) can also be donated.

All kits and soap bars are due by September 15th.

Give to others what God has given to you.



#### School Kit

- 4 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper approximately 8" X 101/2" (no loose-leaf paper )
- 1 30-centimeter ruler, or with centimeters and inches
- 1 pencil sharpener
- 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 5 unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- 5 black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- 1 box of 16 or 24 crayons
- 1 21/2" eraser
- 1 sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14" X 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new & in good condition. Remove any excess packaging, pack all items in bag and close.



#### **Personal Care Kit**

1 light-weight bath-size towel (max. 52" X 27"), dark color

- 2 bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of soap, any brand, wrapped
- 1 adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging
- 1 sturdy comb, remove packaging
- 1 metal nail clippers remove packaging

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Wrap all the items in the towel and tie securely with ribbons or yarn.


#### Fabric Kit



- 2 pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (no knits or 100% polyester). Each piece should match one of the sizes below:
  - ∘2¼ yards of 60" wide fabric, or
  - ∘3 yards of 44" wide fabric, or
  - •4 yards of 36" wide fabric
- 2 spools of neutral-colored all purpose thread, 250-300 yards

Fabric should have no stains or holes. Pieces do not need to match in size or color/pattern. Fold thread and one piece of fabric inside second fabric piece and tie with yarn, sturdy string, ribbon or a strip of fabric.

## Layette Kit



2 long- or short-sleeved gowns or

sleepers (without feet)

2 receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square

- 4 cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- 1 jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- 2 pairs of socks
- 2 bars of gentle soap (4-5 oz bars)
- 1 hand towel, dark color wrapped
- 2 diaper pins or large safety pins

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. Gently used, clean items (no stains or tears) or new. Wrap items in one of the receiving blankets and secure with diaper pins.

## YOUTH & FAMILY MINISTRY

**Who me?** "I can't teach Sunday School. I don't know enough." If I had a nickel for every time I've heard that....heck, if I had a dime for every time I've said it, I'd treat everyone to pizza!!!

When I first joined St. Mark's and my children were small, I was asked to volunteer to teach Sunday School. The first few times, I declined: I was new to the faith, I didn't want to misspeak, I didn't want to look foolish. Then, the third time, I thought, Well, I can teach preschool. How hard can that be?

A couple years later, I was asked to teach the drama rotation when we tried the round-robin method of instruction. Aha! Drama I knew!! Just tell the stories with hand puppets, or act it out, and let the other stations take care of the "rough" questions! I can do this!!

I was still extremely unsure of myself when it came to the Word and theology. You know what? I still am.

Nobody ever "knows enough." I'll be learning about my faith 'til the day I die—and then probably find out I had only a miniscule portion correct!! But, you know what? If you wait until you reach that unknown level of knowledge, you miss out on an incredi-

ble time with our children here in our church family of St. Mark's.

To this day, when I walk in to a catechetical meeting or the middle school classroom, I'm petrified that I will let the students down or disappoint Pastor and all of you. But the fact that I'm there, that I'm interested in all of them, that I care means a lot to these kids. And, yes, there are times that I have had to say, "I don't know," to our youth or mentors. But, I've discovered that that's okay. I go look it up or ask someone more knowledgeable...or, even more fun, we try to figure it out together.

And that in itself is a lesson to our youth. We never stop learning. We never know it all. Our Sunday School education doesn't magically end when we are confirmed. At that point, we assume the responsibility for our own path to Christ and part of that is sharing our journey with others.

Sunday School instruction is one of the most valuable and rewarding ministries of St. Mark's: creating the foundation on which the church can grow in years to come. 
