Anthony is a Sophomore studying marine engineering at California Maritime Academy in Vallejo. Carly is a Freshman at Windsor High School. We are a deployed family. While we are accustomed to family separations as a Navy Chaplain family, this will be our first deployment as an Interim Pastors' family. Therefore, St. Mark's will be my next port of call. These are exciting times for the West family.

REMEMBRANCE OF BAPTISM

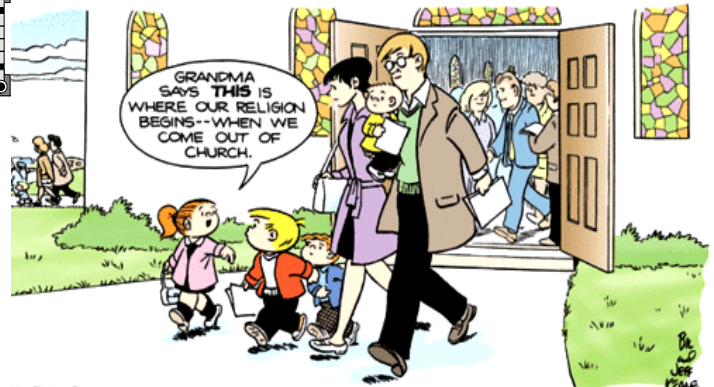

I've learned..... That no matter how serious your life requires you to be, everyone needs a friend to act goofy with.

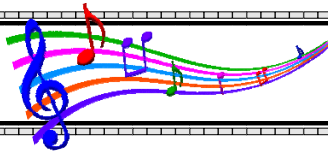
I've learned..... That sometimes all a person needs is a hand to hold and a heart to understand.

I've learned..... That we should be glad God doesn't give us everything we ask for.

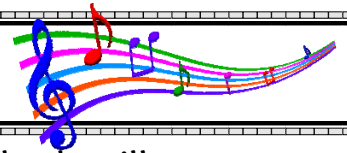
I've learned.... That everyone you meet deserves to be greeted with a smile.

We thank everybody who has already donated. If you are unable to give, please pray for this program as it continues to grow and reach more children around the world each year!



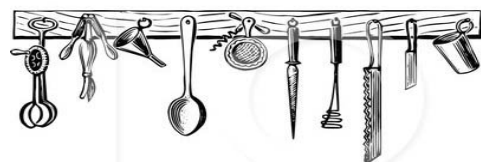
