


A Traditional Easter Basket

Butter is often shaped into a lamb reminding Christians that the Risen Christ id the Lamb of God. **Easter Bread**, a round or long loaf topped with a cross or a fish, is symbolic of Jesus, the Bread of Life. **Horseradish** symbolizes the bitter suffering of Christ. **Hard-boiled Eggs or Pisanki** indicate new life and Christ's Resurrection from the tomb.

Kielbasa (or other sausage/bacon/ham product) symbolizes of God's favor and generosity and reminds us we now live in grace rather than under law. Salt as necessary element in our physical life is symbolic of prosperity and justice and reminds us that people are the flavor of the earth. Cheese indicates the moderation Christians should have at all times. A Candle represents Christ as

the Light of the World. Included **Wine** adds the sweetness of life.



Colorful Ribbons and Sprigs of Greenery are attached to the basket as signs of joy and new life in the season of spring and in celebration of the Resurrection. A Linen Cover is drawn over the top of the basket when it is ready for the trip to church where it is joined with the baskets of others to await the blessing after the Easter Vigil. The food is then set aside and enjoyed on Easter Sunday.

Dear Members and Friends of St. Mark's,

Grace to you and peace.

If it weren't for deadlines, little would get done. This letter is a case in point. I am writing it a few minutes before this newsletter goes to print.

Thank God it's April (TGIA). April is sometimes called the cruelest month. Perhaps it's because of the certainty of death and taxes. I put off both death and taxes. For the Christian, it is a matter of death, resurrection (and taxes, too.)

This year, Holy Week and the beginning of the Easter season happens in the middle of April, along with the deadline of Federal, State, and local taxes, which are due to be paid not later than midnight Tuesday, April 18th.

On the other hand, the discernment process of getting ready to call a pastor is open ended. There is no deadline, only the grace of the time God gives us to gain a sense of who St. Mark's Lutheran Church is now without Pastor Elkin. There's some grief work to be done. That's the death part of interim ministry. Then there's the resurrection piece of what our Lord would have us do now based on where we have been. And yes, there's even a tax part. The work is taxing. There is underlying joy in this taxing labor because it is God's labor of love among us.

Pray for me, as I pray for you, always in Christ Jesus.




