


The Lion of St. Mark's

Some of you may have been wondering if you might want to serve on the call committee. The process has been changing over the past twenty years. I offer this description.

The initial work of the committee involves conversations with both the congregation and community leaders. The goal is to get an accurate picture of both the congregation and the Williamsport area. This work is best done by meeting twice a month, usually at church but sometimes in the community. It also involves briefing the council as well as giving progress briefs to the congregation from the previous week's work.

The goal of the process is to be able to interview pastoral candidates with a clear understanding of the congregation, both its identity and purpose. Likewise, the candidates will have also gone through a thorough process of discernment about who they are and what they wish to accomplish in their calling.

I ask you now, in the light of Christ Jesus' resurrection and our Christian walk of faith, to ask your-selves if you have the gifts or know people who do have these gifts, so that when a member of council asks you if you are willing to serve, you will have a ready answer.

□ DOWN BY THE RIVERSIDE □ Church picnic: June 11, 2017, AT 1:00 pm!!






