### SUMMER CONFIRMATION


<u>CAMP</u> for our students is held this July 10—12, (Monday— Wednesday).

# Meal Packaging Success!

Central Pennsylvania Food Bank, The New Love Center and Redeemer Lutheran Church at no cost to the people they serve. The Central Pennsylvania Food Bank distributes food to the United Churches Food Bank and other charities in response to ending hunger in our area.

We are grateful for the monetary assistance of the New Love Center at St. John Lutheran in Jersey Shore, the St. Luke Fund at St. Luke Lutheran in Williamsport, Thrivent Financial and countless others who made personal contributions. Wegman's and Frito-Lay donated hot dogs, rolls and snacks that were made available to the volunteers.


# DANIEĽS CLOSET


