ABOUT SATURDAY EVENINGS:

The 6 PM Saturday evening service at St. Mark's Lutheran Church may be just what YOU need!

- This service is non-traditional and DOES NOT have the Gregorian chanting. In fact, there was no music at all.
- Held in air-conditioned Chapel for those sensitive to heat of summer!
- Not only is it highly wheelchair accessible, it also gives both the care provider plenty of time to get ready on a Saturday, and then time to get the wheelchair bound loved one ready for service.
 We have guests from another Lutheran church who find this very appealing - and provides some generous and loving time between mother and daughter.
- For those with Fibromyalgia, Rheumatoid Arthritis, any type of Arthritis, stenosis, or any physical illness that makes sitting on a hard, wooden pew extremely uncomfortable, the Chapel has cushioned chairs.
- For those who prefer small groups, there were only 6 in attendance on Saturday, June 24th, plus Pastor West. During the sermon, we sat in a circle

so Pastor could articulate better to those with hearing impairments. It was easier for Pastor West to read the eyes of those who had questions, and allow them to ask their questions.

- Last night, we lightly (and I do mean very lightly) covered the Augsburg Confession and John the Baptist's birth. Growing up in Zion, Sunbury, I had the same confirmation studies as Steve Shipman, Robert L. Driesen, and Kerry Aucker. We had a thorough introduction to the faith. Even so, I learned several new things about John the Baptist last night.
- A better opportunity to get to know Pastor West. He is one of the most mesmerizing ministers I have ever met. Knowledgeable, personable, relaxed, conversational, and delightful are only a few of the adjectives I'd use to describe him. If you're a "sensitive" like me, you can literally feel the Holy Spirit that has infused this man - and his willingness to accept such.
- If you work at any place from a health care facility to a convenience store Sunday morning, work night shift, or your work shift somehow demands time away from church, this gives you an alternative time to get your ash to church!
- If you lack transportation on a Sunday morning, the busses are still running on a Saturday evening.
- If you're a night owl and mornings simply ain't your bag, this is your time to get back in touch with your faith!
- If you're tired of fighting with teenagers about getting up on a Sunday morning for church, you can encourage your teens to attend on a Saturday evening and avoid the Sunday morning hassles! Let them enjoy their time with their friends.
- Pastor West told me the Saturday evening service will give him a greater opportunity to explore more "things." What things? IDK. Meet me there and we'll find out together!
- My husband and I can pick up 2 people anywhere from Montoursville (Wal-Mart area) and take them to church with us.
- After church on a Saturday evening, you are free to do whatever you like for the rest of the night. You're already cleaned up and dressed up as you want to be (jeans are very welcome), so just fly, and let God go with you!
- If you're planning a day trip on Sunday, now you don't have to miss church. Come Saturday evening.
- The services are so different my husband went to the Saturday evening service, so I could attend with my disabilities, and then went again on Sunday morning for the traditional service and to see all his church friends. ~submitted by Kay Poliska

KITS of CARE

We can't control when disaster strikes or end poverty overnight. We can help people dealing with the aftermath of earthquakes and floods, fleeing to escape violence, or living in extreme poverty. We can send Kits of Care from our hands to their hearts.

Bags for the School Kits will be in the Narthex in July. Or, you may choose to make Personal Care Kits, Layette Kits, or Fabric Kits. Soap Bars are also being collected.

All kits and soap bars are due by September 10th.

Put your faith into action!



School Kit

4 - 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper approximately 8" X 10½" (no loose-leaf paper)

- 1 30-centimeter ruler, or with centimeters and inches
- 1 pencil sharpener
- I blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 5 unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- 5 black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- 1 box of 16 or 24 crayons
- 1 sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14" X 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new & in good condition. Remove any excess packaging, pack all items in bag and close.

Personal Care Kit

- 1 light-weight bath-size towel (max. 52" X 27"), dark color
- 2 bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of soap, any brand, wrapped
- 1 adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging
- 1 sturdy comb, remove packaging
- 1 metal nail clippers remove packaging

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Wrap all the items in the towel and tie securely with ribbons or yarn.



Fabric Kit ≫ 2 pieces of cotton or cottonblend fabric (no knits or 100% polyester). Each piece should match

- one of the sizes below:
- \times \circ 2¼ yards of 60" wide fabric, or
- \times °3 yards of 44" wide fabric, or
- \gg •4 yards of 36" wide fabric

Fabric should have no stains or holes. Pieces do not need to match in size or color/pattern. Fold thread and one piece of fabric inside second fabric piece and tie with yarn, sturdy string, ribbon or a strip of fabric.

Layette Kit

2 lightweight cotton tshirts

 2 long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)

- 2 receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square
- 8 4 cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- I jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- 2 pairs of socks
- 2 bars of gentle soap (4-5 oz bars)
- I hand towel, dark color wrapped
- 2 diaper pins or large safety pins

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. Gently used, clean items (no stains or tears) or new. Wrap items in one of the receiving blankets and secure with diaper pins.


