Discussion covered (one topic per week) Church, Ministry, and Eucharist. About 50 people attended: Catholics, St. Mark's folk, and other Lutheran congregations each made up one third of the class. Thank you to all those from here who supported

the program.

At the Joint Catholic-Lutheran Commemoration of the Reformation, on Oct. 25, almost 80 Lutherans and Catholics joined in prayer. Afterwards, almost everyone enjoyed fellowship and food in Fellowship Hall.

The next ecumenical study group will meet at Perkins, near Kohl's and Wegman's, beginning Wednesday, January 3, 2018, at 7:00 pm. The group will study the document *From Conflict to Communion*. For more in-

Dear Members of St. Mark's Church.


Dr. Ted Larson died August 25, 2017 after a lengthy struggle with congestive heart failure. Ted was a life-long member of St. Mark's.



INSTITUTE OF LITURGICAL STUDIES APPOINTS CO-DIRECTORS



The Institute of Liturgical Studies at Valparaiso University has named Jennifer Baker-Trinity as one of the co-directors of the Institute. In her role as a co-director, Baker-Trinity shares the responsibility to lead, supervise and direct the Institute of Liturgical Studies. She, with her co-worker will be responsible for

strategic and tactical planning, oversee day-to-day operations and lead and host the annual conference. Currently under a call by the Upper Susquehanna Synod as a deacon, she leads assembly song at Beaver, Beaver Springs (Pastor Nathan Baker-Trinity). Baker-Trinity earned a bachelor's from Valparaiso University and a master of religion and a master of sacred theology from the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia. She has written widely for the church, and has presented workshops for local and national worship events on language for worship, children in worship and the integral role of music in the liturgy, three of her passions essential to the church's worship. Connected to the Institute for two decades, Baker-Trinity served on the Institute of Liturgical Studies' advisory council from 2006-2012. She has been active for many years in the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians, serving twice previously as conference chair and currently as president for Region 1. Baker-Trinity served congregations in Illinois, Pennsylvania and Minnesota as a church musician, regularly contributing to synod worship events.

"As someone who has been deeply formed and inspired by the work and mission of both the Institute and Valparaiso University, I look forward to sharing in the directorship of the Institute, keeping it a vital source of learning and connection for all who care for the church's worship," Baker-Trinity said. As co-director, Baker-Trinity will work together to educate and renew those who serve the church, continuing the Institute's 70-year endeavor to transform the church through worship.

Jennifer is the niece of Ray Reams of our congregation and the daughter of Ray's sister Nancy Reams Baker. Nancy "grew up" at St. Mark's.





They would add coins to those boxes with a prayer each time they would think of a particular blessing. It could be a small thing like a baby's smile or a new flower opening.

Or, it could be safety after a storm or recovery from an illness. Those offerings would be given to God in gratitude. Women today are encouraged to continue this tradition. If you wish, small boxes are available in the Narthex, or you can make your own container.
