The congregational council met on Monday, November 20, 2017, and determined the following:

- That the proposed budget be amended to reflect that \$500 is allotted to Outreach Ministries under "Expenses for Benevolence and Charity"
- The approval of the proposed budget, as amended
- To support Dawson Owen in his senior project to collect snacks for Sojourner Truth Ministries; he will place a collection tub in the Narthex
- The expanding of the Personnel committee by two members for better congregational representation; the additional members will be non-council members, one of which will be appointed by the Pastor and one by the council president
- Discussed church security in active shooter situations

A congregational meeting was held in two sessions on Sunday, December 17. The budget presented by the finance committee and the council was approved.

Souper Bowl Sunday is one way to help a ministry to assist people in need. The West End Christian Community Center (WECCC) Shoe Express is a program that gives free new sneakers and socks to children from birth to 18 who live in the Williamsport area. To qualify, children need to come with a parent or guardian. They must also have a CHIP or Access card or a referral letter from a social service agency or church. The program is open the first and third Saturdays of each month, excluding July, from 10 - noon. The program cannot run without support from volunteers and donations.
