You may have noticed that it's March and I am still here as your interim pastor.

I share your impatience and wonderment, be-wilderment perhaps, too. We have a big word that covers this situation: Discernment. Discernment means listening. It means listening for that still small voice that speaks volumes, shakes mountains, and thunders out of the blue. I'm referring to Elijah's experience in his hiding place. The full account is written in 1 Kings 19. The call committee is being still in order to hear God's call. At the same time, pastors are being still in order to hear that same call. Together they are spending this precious time to discern whether or not they are hearing God's call to serve at St. Mark's.

I hadn't seen it this way until I spent some time reading 1 Kings 19 with discernment in these days of the interim. Interim ministry is a bit like living in a cave for me with my immediate family in Colorado. And for the congregation waiting for the Lord to reveal the name of the next pastor, there are hurricane force winds, mountains falling apart, an earth-

quake and finally a fire. I'm speaking poetically, certainly. This is how God makes all things new out of the heritage we've been given.

Through it all, we get to discover what God has in mind for the people, of late, us, who gather at 142 Market Street who call upon the Lord for life, forgiveness and salvation.

Pray for me, as I pray for you, always in Christ Jesus.

All of the volunteers made the week go smoothly and made the families feel welcome. They were impressed with our facilities and our members.







The weather was at a low of 16° when we started at 9:00 a.m., but warmed up to about 33° by the time we left at 2:00. While there, we collected 303 individual food items and \$260 in monetary donations. Folks were really friendly and some even left and then returned with more food! Again, Eagles fans predominated. Though there was one Pennsylvanian who was solidly behind the Patriots (granted, he was wearing a Steelers jacket and hat)! WE are extremely thankful that Sam's allowed us to set up out there for the day!

We are also thankful to other stores who helped us out, too. We received gift cards from Wegmans Food Store, Giant Markets, and Weis Markets. With those, we were able to purchase 85 more cans of food!

We more than tripled the amount of our usual donations:

With all this, St. Mark's was overjoyed to contribute 537 food items to the Lycoming County Food Bank, 4 #10 cans of vegetables to St. Anthony's Center, and over \$413.16 to Shepherd of the Streets. In this, as in all things we are thankful for God's guidance in all we do.
