- ◆ The Emergency Fund is currently depleted. A donation envelope is available in the Narthex for the Emergency Fund.
- ◆ The donations collected at the July 4th Celebration in the amount of \$401.29 will be divided equally between the United Churches Food Pantry and Shephard of the Streets.
- Council will be working on a gift policy.
- ◆ Captain Jody Miller of the Williamsport City Police Dept. will conduct a security assessment of the church on July 18, 2018.

- The need for more members to become involved in committees and leadership rolls was discussed.
- A brief update was provided by Mel Wetzel on the status of calling a new pastor which echoed the update provided to the congregation by Joyce Hershberger on Sunday.
- Council members were encouraged to attend staff meetings held every Monday at 10:03 a.m.
- Cashbox theft from the secretary's office was discussed and new measures will be enforced going forward to ensure security of the building.
- Additional information was provided on the security training that was attended by Pastor and a few other council members.

Action items:

- Approved to appoint Herb Poff as a new council member beginning September 2018 for a 3 year term.
- Previous tabled item from the May meeting to host a play in September was discussed, voted on and not approved.
- After deliberation, accepted and approved the recommendations of the Personnel Committee regarding staffing.

KITS of CARE—Gifts from God

Imagine not having soap to wash your baby! Experiencing natural disasters, violence, or living in poverty is a way of life for many people. Ordinary items, such as pencil and paper or soap and a towel for a child, can make a difference for people who have nothing.

Summer sales in stores will begin soon. Bags for School Kits will be in the Narthex in July. Fill them with the school items listed and return them over the summer. Or, you may wish to make up Personal Care Kits, Baby Care Kits, Fabric Kits, or donate soap bars. Kits of Care bring relief and hope!

All kits and soap bars are due by September 10th.

Put your faith into action!



School Kit

- 4 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper approximately 8" X 10½" (no loose-leaf paper)
- 1 30-centimeter ruler, or with centimeters and inches
- ✓ 1 pencil sharpener
- 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- gether with a rubber band
- 5 black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- ✓ 1 box of 16 or 24 crayons
- √ 1 2½" eraser
- ✓ 1 sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14" X 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new & in good condition. Remove any excess packaging, pack all items in bag and close.

Personal Care Kit

- 1 light-weight bath-size towel (max. 52" X 27"), dark color
- 2 bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of soap, any brand, wrapped
- 1 adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging
- 1 sturdy comb, remove packaging
- 1 metal nail clippers remove packaging

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. All items should be new and in good condition. Wrap all the items in the towel and tie securely with ribbons or yarn.

Fabric Kit



× 2 pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (no knits or 100% polyester). Each piece should match one of the sizes below:

- × 21/4 yards of 60" wide fabric, or
- × 3 yards of 44" wide fabric, or
- ★ 2 spools of neutral-colored all purpose thread, 250-300 yards

Fabric should have no stains or holes. Pieces do not need to match in size or color/pattern. Fold thread and one piece of fabric inside second fabric piece and tie with yarn, sturdy string, ribbon or a strip of fabric.



Layette Kit

- 2 lightweight cotton t-shirts
- ∂ 2 long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- 2 receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square
- 8 4 cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- 8 1 jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- 2 pairs of socks
- 2 bars of gentle soap (4-5 oz bars)
- ∂ 1 hand towel, dark color wrapped
- 2 diaper pins or large safety pins

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed. Gently used, clean items (no stains or tears) or new. Wrap items in one of the receiving blankets and secure with diaper pins.

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


NEW SAFETY PROTOCOL
