MARCH 2019



Beginning on Ash Wednesday, Lent is a season of reflection and preparation before the celebrations of Easter. By observing the 40 days of Lent, Christians replicate Jesus Christ's sacrifice and withdrawal into the desert for 40 days. Lent is based on sacrifice, so most Christians choose to stop eating a favorite food or pursuing a favorite activity. However, you can also choose to do something instead. For example, say an extra prayer every day, go to Church twice a week, or read some scripture verses.

On March 6, we begin our Lenten obligations with our traditional **Ash Wednesday** services with **Holy Communion**: at 11:30 a.m. in the Chapel and in the Nave at 7:00 p.m.

On each **Wednesday** of Lent, we have **Mid-day Prayer** in the Chapel at 11:30 a.m. All are invited to join us for a lunch of hearty soup after the service.

Wednesday evenings our time together begins with Bible Study at 5:00, followed at 7:00 by Vespers.

Morning Prayer continues Monday-Thursday at 9:00 AM in the chapel.

On **Palm Sunday**, April 14, we will process with palms and celebrate Holy Communion at 8:00 and 10:30 a.m. In preparation for that, we are in Fellowship Hall on **Saturday** morning, April 13, to make palm crosses—please join us.

The **Seder Meal** is on Wednesday, April 17. Assistance is welcome and appreciated on that Tuesday and Wednesday afternoon to set the room and help with meal preparations.

Worship on **Maundy Thursday** is 7:00 p.m. in the Nave.

The doors of St. Mark's will be open for three hours (noon-3:00) on **Good Friday** for any who wish to come in to pray, meditate, or follow the stations of the Cross. **Tenebrae** is at 7:00 p.m. in our Nave.

The **Easter Vigil** on Saturday, April 20, begins in the Chapel at 8:00 p.m. and moves into the Nave for the first celebration of Easter.

The theme invites us to "come…everything is ready." Come to praise, thank, and proclaim the kingdom of love. The invitation is grounded in the parable Jesus told about a great feast which was attended by the folks called off the streets, as those invited excused themselves. Come, there is a place for you! Refreshments will be served after the celebration. Parking is available in the parking lot next to the church. The church is not handicapped accessible.


