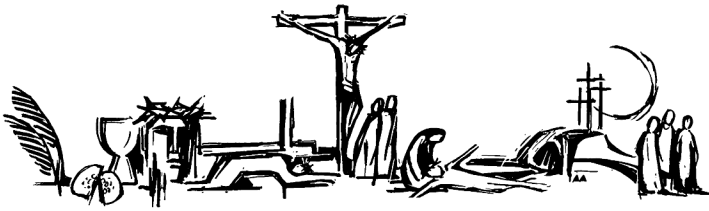




# THE LION OF ST. MARK'S

APRIL 2019



Beginning April 14, we remember the last days of Jesus' earthly life and it is this time of remembering that we call "Holy Week." Holy Week recalls the events of the week that led up to the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Over the years, this week has been considered the most important and holy time in the life of the church—especially what is known as the "Triduum" — or Great Three Days — of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter morning.

**Palm Sunday** (4/14) marks the beginning of Holy Week. We rejoice with the crowds as Jesus enters into the city of Jerusalem, waving palms and shouting "Hosanna!" That day is when we read the Passion during worship at 8:00 and 10:30am.

At the **Seder Meal**, on Wednesday, 4/17, we remember our roots as well as Christ's final meal. The readings, the questions of a child, the four glasses of wine, the lamb, and the Seder plate, which holds the egg, the bitter herb, matzoh, haroset, maror, and salt water...all the history and the symbols of the Exodus are present. We begin at 6:15.

**Maundy Thursday** takes its name from the Latin word for "commandment," as we remember when Jesus told his disciples, "A new commandment I give to you: Love one another." We remember the first Lord's Supper and the washing of the disciples' feet. Worship on April 18, at 7 pm.

On **Good Friday**, the doors of St Mark's will be open for three hours (12—3) for anyone who would like to come in to spend some time in contemplation and prayer. Prayers to accompany the Stations of the Cross are available. **Tenebrae** (Service of Shadows) begins at 7:00 in our Nave.

The **Easter Vigil** on Saturday, April 20, begins in the Chapel at 8:00 p.m. and moves into the Nave for the first celebration of Easter—a meaningful, joyful experience.

**Easter Sunday** is the day of the resurrection – a joyous celebration of God's victory over sin and death.

Grace to you and peace.

March comes or goes like a lion. April may or may not be the cruelest month. May may bring flowers, and June, brides. Fact is we get crocuses in March. All this is my way of saying, "Pay attention! God is up to something all the time and desires to include us in those plans. What rhymes with plans?"

Answer: Banns

In the form of question: "What is a notice read out on three successive Sundays in a parish church (as in the Church of England or the Church of Wales), announcing an intended marriage and giving the opportunity for objections?"

That was a play on the game show Jeopardy. At St. Mark's it's a play on what is about to happen when we celebrate the 5th Sunday in (not of) Lent at the 8 a.m. service. Brian Jackson and Nikki Young have been attending services here for several years. I thought that they were life long members, but to the contrary, they officially joined the congregation this past March, through the Affirmation of Faith. They will with their promises before God and this congregation, become husband and wife, unless someone objects. Their wedding invitation includes you. It will be published along with the banns in the Sunday bulletin.

Here's how the banns were sometimes announced among Lutherans in North America.

*The Minister may publish the Banns in the Church, one or more Sundays before the day appointed for the Marriage, saying: N.N. and N.N. purpose to enter into the holy estate of Matrimony, according to God's ordinance. They desire that prayer be made for them, that they may enter into this union in the Name of the Lord, and be prospered in it. If any one can show just cause why they may not be joined together, I exhort him to make known such objection before the day of the marriage. (Service Book and Hymnal, page 270.)*

Weddings show us the way God works in this world. Think of this wedding as a preview of Holy Week, when we recall how Jesus died to make us one with God.

God is crazy in love with us and sets marriage apart as a living parable of how it is between God and the People of God. Once wedded, marriage is a picture of how God works in the Church, the body of Christ. Only through love, mercy and forgiveness can a marriage or a congregation live well, or in the words from Service Book, "... and be prepared in it." Any objections? .
