There is No Vacation from Hunger

Did you know that one in six children in the Greater Williamsport Area is considered food insecure? With the school year concluding, a burden to provide those extra meals that were eaten at school is placed on food insecure families with children. Summertime sees the Food Pantry go into overdrive filling requests for a three-day supply of food.

During the month of June please consider filling a grocery bag with non-perishable food items and placing it in the bin in the Narthex. We will also be collecting hygiene products for the Shepherd of the Streets' office. Regular-sized items are needed for infants, children and adults. Any assistance you can give is greatly appreciated by the staff and volunteers of the United Churches Food Pantry, the Shepherd's office and the families they serve.

Our family wishes to extend our most humble and heartfelt thank-you's to the entire congregation for all your prayers, thoughts, and financial support of Ashton Ott. My daughter, Beth Miller, has been on an unpaid leave of absence since March 26, 2019. She is staying with Ashton at CHOP, sleeping on



a cot in his room so she can be beside him every step of the way. Ashton's Dad, Robb, will be going back to work April 29, 2019. Ashton's brothers, Dylan, Hudson, and Nolan are still keeping up with their classes at Loy-alsock Township School District. Robb is taking care of Ashton's brothers at home.

As of this moment, there is no new news. Ashton's bilirubin, creatinine, and white blood cell count continued to be monitored on a daily basis. His doctors describe "common" post-op liver transplant surgery complications. Perhaps the greatest concern is his kidney function. He has had two belly taps. The first one extracted 6 (yes, six) liters of fluid. Beth didn't say how much was extracted the second time. He continues to be monitored for organ rejection.

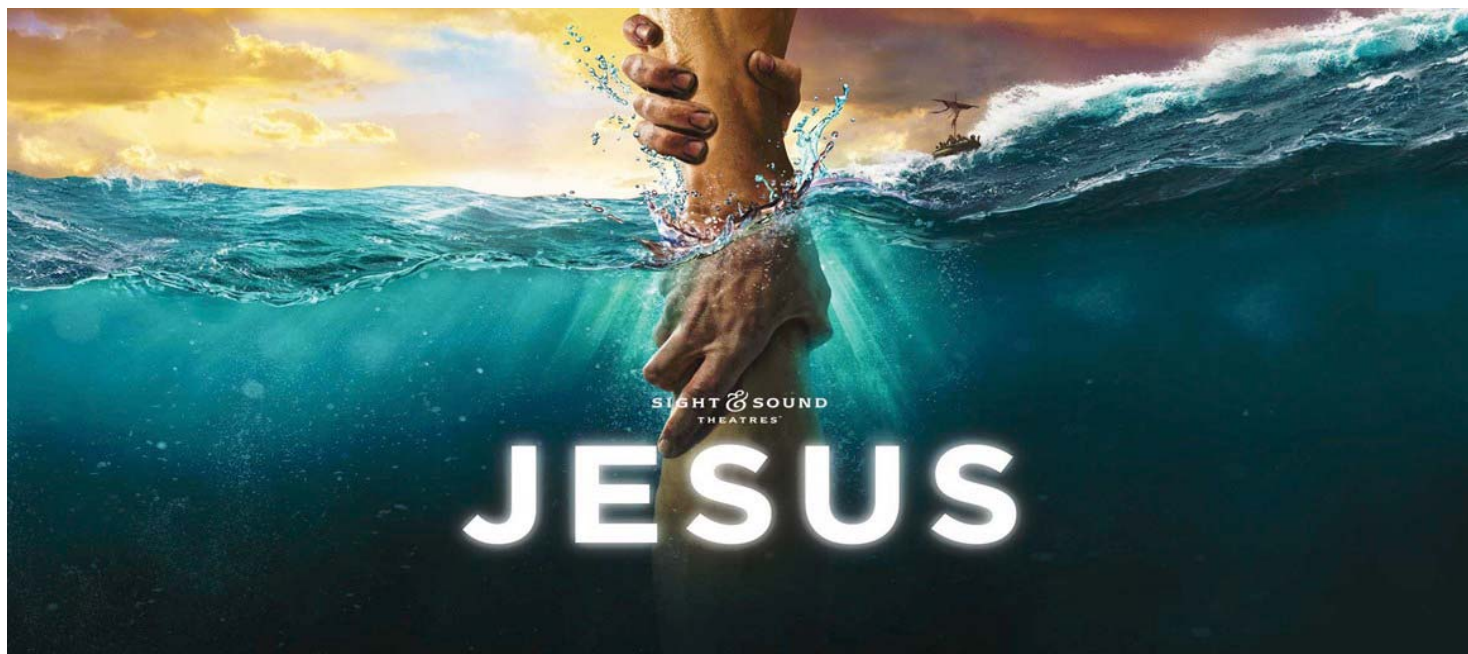
