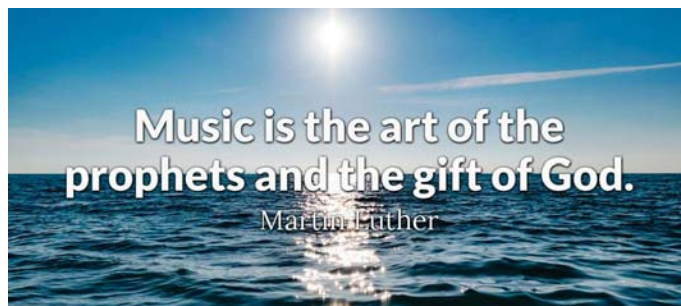
## Family Promise

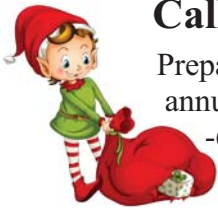

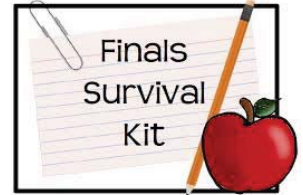

That when they are uncertain and unsure of their path, that they seek guidance from God. And, that when they feel overwhelmed, and a crushing weight pushes them to their knees, that they are able to look up and know they are not alone.*

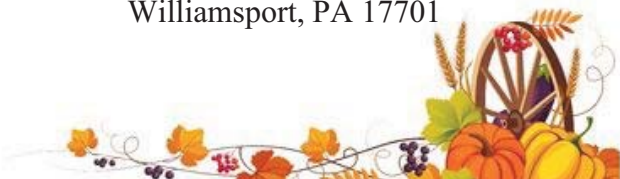
