Dear Members and Friends of St. Mark's,

All Saints' Day is traditionally seen as the Church's "Memorial Day". This is the day on which the local church remembers both the baptized and the deceased members of our congregation, or as we express it: Those who have joined both the Servant Church and the Church Triumphant. On All Saints' Day, November 1, 2020 we will read those names in worship and remind ourselves of the life, love, hope and comfort faith brings.

This day is a reminder to us that we are connected to Christ and one another. None of us are part of the church "by chance". Our grandparents, parents, spouses, relatives, friends, Sunday School teachers, pastors and others have helped to shape our understanding of who God is and what our callings are in response to God's love in Jesus Christ. This festival proclaims that we are part of a sacred community- the "Communion of Saints"- one people who have placed their hopes, dreams and livelihoods in Christ and in those who have trusted Christ. All Saints' is a day about the past- All the baptized who have gone before us; the present- All the baptized who journey in life with us; and the future- All the baptized who will come after us. One communion. One community. One family- the Family of God.

This year, the Tuesday following All Saints' in the USA is election day. On election day most of us, if we have not done so already, will cast our vote; select our choices for elected office. Sometimes salvation in the church is called "election". Election as a church term does not mean we have elected or chosen God. Election in the church means God has elected or chosen us. The Holy Spirit has called us to love and serve God by loving and serving others. All believers in Christ are called to this general ministry of love and our baptism is our "ordination". All Saints' serves as a reminder of this truth.

God through Christ has assured us of divine love; the grace of God has "elected" us to serve God in Christ by serving others. It is a calling made known to us in our baptism that assures us of life eternal within God's community- the Communion of Saints.
